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#### Recommendation:

Staff recommends the City Council receive and file the Investment Report for the month ended January 31, 2021.

#### Background:

This report is prepared and presented to the City Manager and City Council pursuant to the City's Investment Policy and the California Government Code requirements. The City's investment policy requires the Treasurer or Chief Fiscal Officer to render monthly investment reports to the City Manager and the City Council. It requires certain information about the City's investments to be presented in the report and that the report contains statements that:

- 1) The City is in compliance with its investment policy; and
- 2) The City is able to meet its expenditure requirements for the following six (6) months or provide an explanation why sufficient funds will or may not be available.

The City's investment strategy continues to prioritize its investment opportunities on the following; in order of importance:

- 1) Safety;
- 2) Liquidity; and
- 3) Yield

This strategy is consistent with the Government Code and stresses keeping the citizens' funds safe and available for operations, rather than attempting to maximize returns by making riskier investments.

The Finance Department has prepared the Investment Report for the month ended January 31, 2021. This report meets the latest requirements of the City's Investment Policy as presented to the City Council on June 16, 2020, as well as Government Code Section 53646.

#### Discussion:

The market value of the City's total cash and Investments on January 31, 2021, is \$45,066,461 compared to \$44,811,733 on December 31, 2020. This is a \$254,728 increase from the previous month (\$227,032 increase on the cost basis).

The \$6,807,104 decrease in cash on hand from December to January was primarily due to a cash transfer of \$7,000,000 from the Money Market Accounts and into the Local Agency Investment Fund (LAIF) and a sales tax deposit received. The slight increase in investments is primarily due to the Local Agency Investment Fund (LAIF) and interest income received from the Union Bank Money Market Account.

As of January 31, 2021, the City has \$33.6 million (74.56%) of its Cash and Investment Portfolio held in the State of California Local Agency Investment Fund ("LAIF"), which earned 0.63% during the quarter (ended December 31, 2020). This earnings rate exceeded the short-term benchmark. Other cash pools held a combined \$6.1 million (13.71%) of the City's Cash and Investment Portfolio. The City also has \$3.1 million (6.91% of its Portfolio) held by UnionBanc Investment Services ("UBIS") and invested, pursuant to City instructions, in Certificates of Deposit and Governmental Securities with a Money Market account being used to maximize returns on otherwise idle cash.

The metrics used in the attached report are based on Securities issued by the United States Government. The short-term benchmark of 0.08 % is the average earned by a 3-month Treasury Bill during the month ended December 31, 2020, and the long and medium-term benchmark of 0.17 % is the average earnings of 2-year and 3-year treasury notes during that time frame. Lastly, the one-year U.S Treasury benchmark for the month ended January 31, 2021, was 0.10%.

All the information presented in this report is consistent with the disclosures included in the City's Audited Financial Statements previously presented to the City Council.

WHEREAS Agency has the need to secure expert training and consulting services to assist Agency in its workforce management and employee relations; and

WHEREAS Agency has determined that no less than forty-three (43) public agencies in the Central Valley area have the same need and have agreed to enter into identical agreements with Attorney; and

WHEREAS Attorney is specially experienced and qualified to perform the special services desired by the Agency and is willing to perform such services;

NOW, THEREFORE, Agency and Attorney agree as follows:

#### **Attorney's Services:**

During the period of January 5, 2021 through June 30, 2021, Attorney will provide the following services to Agency (and the other aforesaid public agencies):

1. The Agency will be billed for the actual time such representation services are rendered, including reasonable travel time, plus any necessary costs and expenses authorized by the Agency.

The range of hourly rates for Attorney time is from Two Hundred Ten to Three Hundred Ninety Dollars (\$210.00 - \$390.00) per hour for attorney staff, Two Hundred Forty Dollars (\$240.00) per hour for Labor Relations/HR Consultant and from One Hundred Thirty-Five to One Hundred Seventy-Five Dollars (\$135.00 - \$175.00) per hour for services provided by paraprofessional and litigation support staff. Attorneys, paraprofessional and litigation support staff bill their time in minimum units of one-tenth of an hour. Attorney reviews its hourly rates on an annual basis and if appropriate, adjusts them effective July 1.

#### **Independent Contractor:**

It is understood and agreed that Attorney is and shall remain an independent contractor under this Agreement.

#### Term:

#### Recommendation:

#### Discussion:

Liebert Cassidy Whitmore (LCW) represents public sector agencies in the areas of employment law and labor relations. LCW created the Employer Relations Consortium (ERC), an ERC is a number of local agencies within a geographic area join together for the purpose of securing quality employment relation training, consultation, and information services on an economic basis. The City will benefit from training workshops, monthly newsletters, and complimentary telephone consultation. Endorse the First Amendment to Agreement with Kern Plumbing & Backflow Services, Inc. to Continue Operating the Cross-Connection Control Program in an Amount not to Exceed \$6,000 per year for two

years with an end total of \$12,000.

#### Recommendation:

Staff recommends the City Council adopt a resolution authorizing the City Manager to execute and endorse an agreement to continue services with Kern Plumbing & Backflow Services, Inc. to operate the Cross-Connection Control Program in an Amount not to Exceed \$6,000 per year for two years with an end total of \$12,000.

#### Discussion:

Title 17, Section 7584 of the California Code of Regulations, requires each public water system to have a cross-connection control program. The purpose of the cross-connection control program is to reduce the hazard of contamination of the public water system by identifying actual and potential cross-connections and taking action to protect the system from these hazards. A cross-connection is an actual and potential unprotected connection between a potable water system and any source or system containing unapproved water or a substance which is not safe.

The City previously contracted with Kern County Department of Public Health Services to implement a cross-connection control program. The County terminated the cross-connection control program services at the end of 2019 due to the retirement of their specialist.

The program requires that a certified backflow tester administer the cross-connection control program. None of the existing staff is certified to administer the program. In December 2019, staff contacted several certified backflow organizations, and only Kern Plumbing & Backflow Services, Inc. provided a proposal. The City entered into a one-year contract with Kern Plumbing & Backflow Services,

Inc. to operate the Cross-Connection Control Program for the City in an Amount not to Exceed \$5,800. Staff has been satisfied with the services provided by the organization.

Kern Plumbing & Backflow Services, Inc. has notified the staff that the cost will be going up by \$200 a year due to the time spent correcting customer's changes in billing addresses and backflow testers not filling the paperwork out correctly.

The cost for Kern Plumbing & Backflow Services, Inc. to operate the City's Back Flow Program will cost \$6,000 a year and \$12,000 for two years.

Staff recommends the City approve amendment number one to the original agreement to enter into a two-year contract with Kern Plumbing & Backflow Services, Inc. to continue operating the Cross-Connection Control Program in an amount not to Exceed \$12,000 for two years. The agreement has an option to extend for an additional year.

#### Fiscal Impact:

The City paid Kern Plumbing & Backflow Services, Inc. \$5,800 for the administration of the cross-connection control program for the 2020 year. The financial impact is an approximate increase of \$200 per year for a total increase of \$400 over a two year period.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and conditions set forth hereinafter, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. The parties incorporate the foregoing recitals as if fully set forth herein verbatim.
  - 2. City hereby contracts with Consultant to perform the Services.
- 3. City shall pay Consultant \$5,800.00 (the "Fee") upon City's execution of this Agreement as payment in full for performance of the Services for the Term described in paragraph 4 of this Agreement. There shall be no other charges payable by the City.
- 4. Unless earlier terminated as hereinafter described, the term of this Agreement (the "Term") shall be for one year from the date hereof provided, however, that City shall have the option to extend the Term for an additional one year under the same terms and conditions as described herein upon written notice to Consultant prior to expiration of the Term.
- 5. Consultant shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless City, its officers, Councilmembers, employees, and agents from any and all claims, liabilities, expenses, and damages, including attorney's fees, for injury to or death of any person, and for damage to any property, arising out of or in any way connected with any act or omission by or on behalf of Consultant.
- 6. Without limiting Consultant's obligations under Paragraph 5 of this Agreement, Consultant shall obtain and maintain during the life of this Agreement



comprehensive general liability insurance coverage, in an amount of \$1 million per occurrence and automobile liability for owned, hired, and non-owned vehicles. Consultant shall provide City with appropriate certificates of insurance and endorsements for the foregoing in which City, its officers, Councilmembers, employees, and agents are named as additional insureds and specifically designating all such insurance as primary, and providing that same shall not be terminated nor coverage reduced without ten days prior written notice to City.

- 7. Consultant shall not assign its interest herein or any part thereof and any attempted assignment shall be void.
- 8. Either party may terminate this Agreement at any time by giving the other party ten (10) days prior written notice, provided that in such event Consultant shall be entitled to a pro rata share of the Fee and Consultant shall return that portion of the Fee equal to the percentage of the Term still remaining after the date of termination.
- 9. All notices required to be given under this Agreement or by law shall be in writing and shall be deemed received by the party to whom directed if personally served or when faxed or when sent by electronic mail ("email") or when deposited in the United States mail, postage prepaid, first class, or addressed as follows: If to City, City Manager, 746 8th Street, Wasco, California 93280, Fax (661) 758-7239, Email: daortiz@ci.wasco.ca.us, or if to Consultant, sales@kernpbs.com, Kern Plumbing & Backflow Services Inc., 9530 Hageman Road, Suite B-140, Bakersfield, California 93312, Fax (661) 587-0695, Email: sales@kernpbs.com. Any party may change its address by giving notice to the other party in the manner herein described.
- 10. Time is of the essence with regard to each covenant, condition and provision of this Agreement.
- 11. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California.
- 12. This Agreement constitutes the entire Agreement between the parties with regard to the subject matter herein and supersedes all prior oral and written agreements and understandings between the parties with respect thereto.
- 13. This Agreement may not be altered, amended, or modified except by a writing executed by duly authorized representatives of all parties.



- 14. In the event any action or proceeding is instituted arising out of or relating to this Agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled to its reasonable attorneys' fees and actual costs.
- 15. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts. A facsimile or electronic copy of this fully executed agreement shall be as effective as the original for all purposes.
- 16. Waiver by a party of any provision of this Agreement shall not be considered a continuing waiver or a waiver of any other provision, including the time for performance of any such provision.
- 17. This Agreement shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the parties hereto, and their respective heirs, successors, and assigns.
- 18. If any term, provision, covenant or condition of this Agreement is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void, or unenforceable, the remainder of the provisions shall remain in full force and effect and not be affected, impaired, or invalidated thereby.
- 19. City and Consultant each acknowledge that each party and their respective legal counsel have reviewed this Agreement and agree that this Agreement is the product of negotiations between the parties. This Agreement shall be interpreted without reference to the rule of interpretation of documents that uncertainties or ambiguities therein shall be determined against the party so drafting the Agreement.
