IMPORTANT NOTICE REGARDING MARCH 1, 2022 COUNCIL MEETING

As emergency conditions persist in the City, specifically, a state of emergency remains in effect related to COVID-19, community transmission of COVID-19 in Kern County has rapidly increased from Low to High due to the highly contagious variants of COVID-19, which has emerged, Kern County officials are imposing and recommending measures to promote social distancing, requires masking by all, regardless of vaccination status, in an effort to slow the continuously high trends in and level of transmission of COVID-19 throughout the State and Kern County. The City originally budgeted \$130,000.00 in the 2021-22 budget. The construction cost was \$81,800.00, which fell within the budget. No budget action is required.

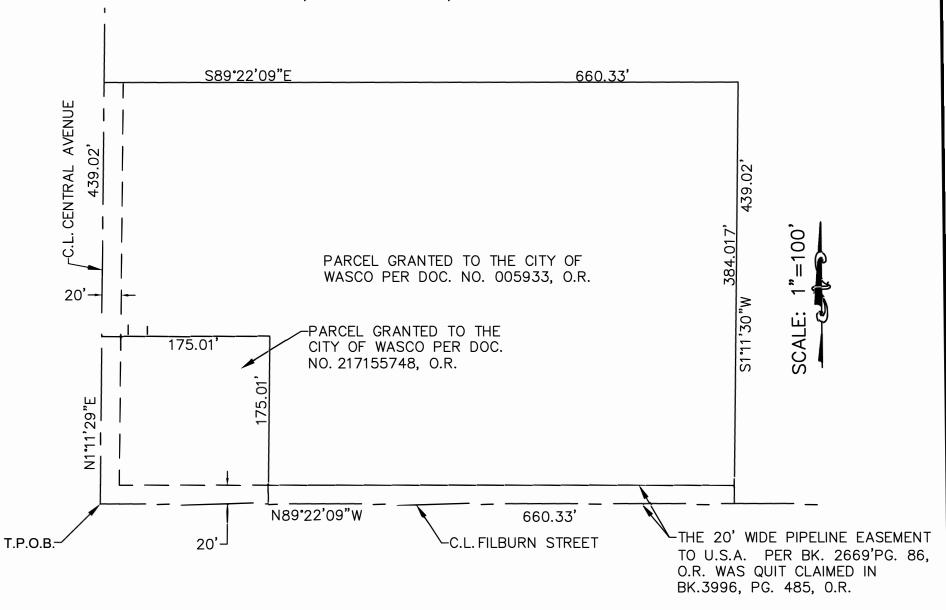

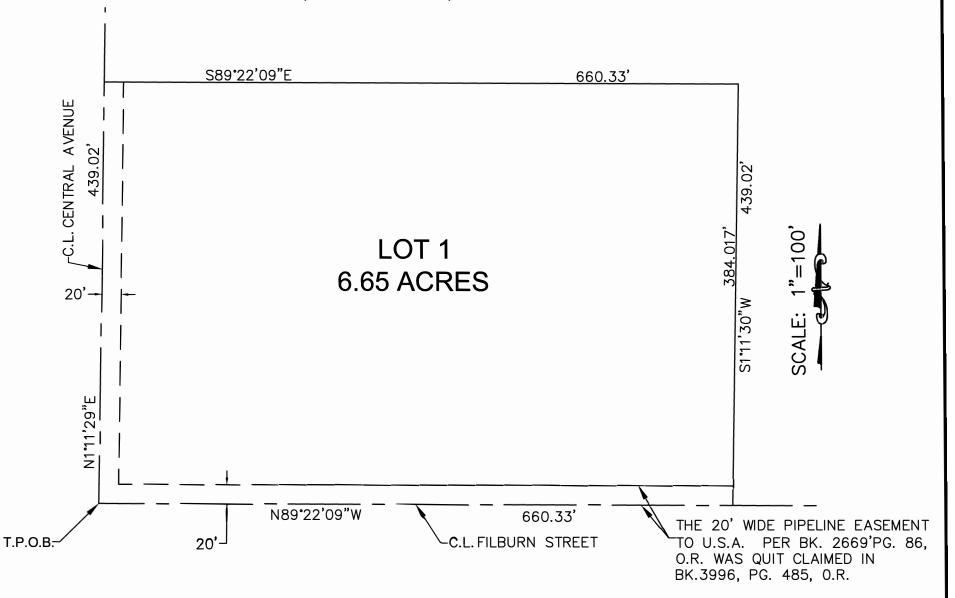

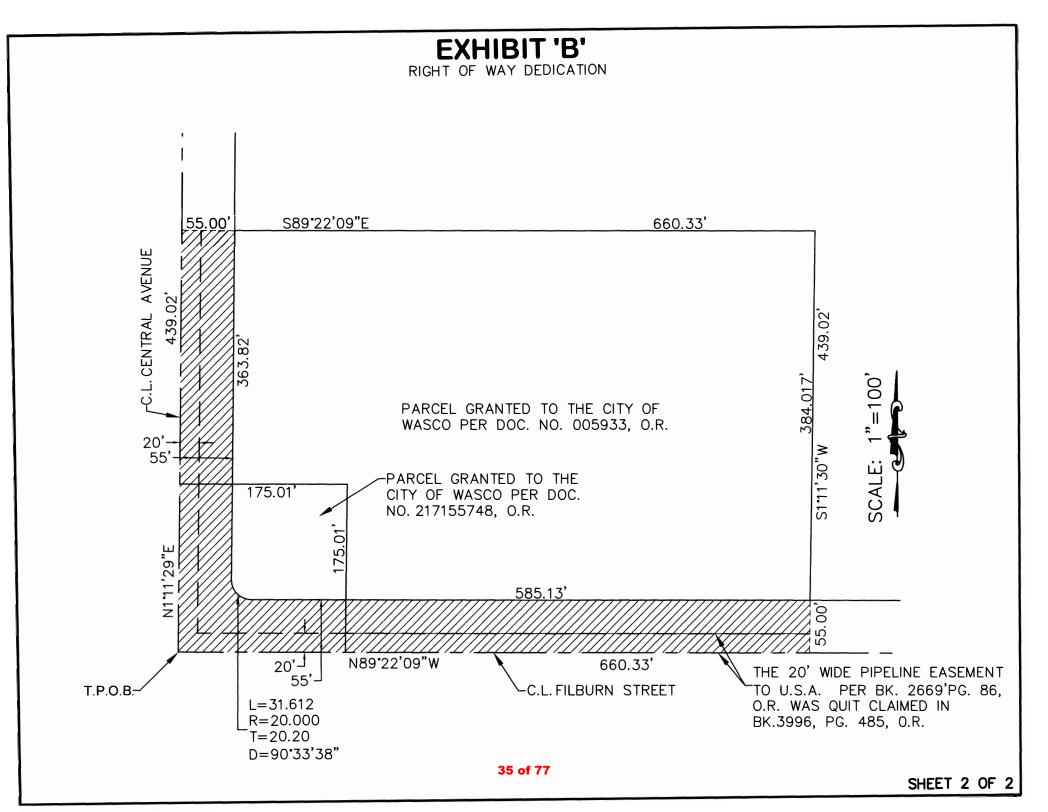

Project

Recommendation:

Staff recommends adopting a resolution authorizing the City Manager to execute a task order with the City's Contract City Engineer to conduct a Topographic Survey and Mapping for the City's Downtown Streetscape Re-design Project.

Discussion:

As part of the City's efforts to re-design the downtown streetscape, the City recently submitted a CLEAN California Grant to design and construct improvements to the Downtown Streetscape. Should the City's application be successful, both the budget and the timeline will be tight. In order to move this project forward so that it is ready for final design and bidding when and/or if funding becomes available, a topographic survey and mapping need to be completed.

The City's contract City Engineer has prepared a cost proposal in the amount of \$41,620 to complete this survey. The staff believes that moving this next step of the project forward now will help streamline the project schedule when funding for final design and construction becomes available. The estimated time for completion of this survey is 4-6 weeks.

Fiscal Impact:

Project Number 22012 (Historic Downtown District Landscape Redesign and Rehabilitation) in the 2021-2022 CIP states a total project cost of \$825,000. The cost proposal provided by BHT for the topographic survey and mapping totals \$41,620 in design, leaving \$83,380 remaining in the design phase of the project. See the CIP project budget below.

Uponapproval of each such invoice by the City Council, same shall be paid in the regular cycle of payments made by City for other bills and claims.

Background:

The City's Public Works yard drive approach is experiencing severe pavement failure. Because patrons utilize this area as an entry point to the Public Works office, it poses a trip hazard to customers and must be repaired. The parking apron abutting the man door is also in disrepair and requires rehabilitation.

After reviewing the bid submittals, Staff has determined that American Enviro Services, INC is the lowest cost qualified bidder. As such, Staff recommends awarding the Project to American Enviro Services, INC.

The City originally budgeted \$45,000.00 in the 2021 - 22 budget. The City has expended to date \$303.00 on advertisement for the Project. The bid of \$26,399.00 falls within budget and allows \$18,298.00 for contingencies during the project duration.

AGREEMENT 2022 -

THIS AGREEMENT made this <u>1st</u> day of <u>March</u> 2022, by and between the CITY OF WASCO, hereinafter "City," and American Enviro Services, INC., a California Corporation, hereinafter "Contractor,"

WHEREAS, City wishes to hire Contractor to remove damaged concrete, grade, and compact, and replace concrete at the City Public Works yard and such other services as more particularly described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof (the "Services") under the terms and conditions described hereinafter and Contractor is agreeable thereto.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and conditions set forth hereinafter, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. The parties incorporate the foregoing recitals as if fully set forth herein verbatim.
- 2. Contractor hereby agrees to perform the Services under the terms and conditions described hereinafter.
- 3. Contractor shall perform the Services for a total price of not to exceed \$26,399.00 (the "Total Price"). The Total Price shall be payable upon completion and acceptance of the Services by the City and after receipt of an invoice from Contractor, which shall be subject to approval by the City Manager and the City Council.
- 4. Contractor shall complete the Services within thirty (30) working days after issuance of a Notice to Proceed by the City.
- 5. Contractor shall provide a performance bond to insure completion of the Services and a payment bond to insure payment to subcontractors and suppliers, each in the full amount of the Total Price and as approved by City. In the performance of Contractor's duties hereunder, Contractor shall also provide all vehicles, tools, personnel, equipment, supplies, and all such other items as are necessary or convenient to completing the Services at Contractor's sole cost and expense.
- 6. Contractor, at Contractor's sole cost and expense, shall maintain throughout the term of this Agreement all worker's compensation insurance where

and in the amounts required by law and a comprehensive general public liability insurance policy from a company approved by City for protection against liability to the public arising as an incident of Contractor's performance hereunder in amounts not less than \$1 million per occurrence and said policy shall be primary insurance naming City, its officers, councilpersons, employees, contractors, and representatives as additional insureds and affording City at least ten (10) days notice prior to cancellation or reduction of coverage. In the event any such policy shall lapse or be canceled, City may, at City's sole discretion, terminate this Agreement without further notice to Contractor. Contractor shall provide City with a Certificate of Insurance verifying Contractor's compliance with the foregoing. This Agreement shall not be effective until City has received and approved same.

- 7. Contractor shall pay, and shall require subcontractors to pay, employees working for a salary or wage at least equal to the prevailing salary or wage established for such work as set forth in the wage determination and wage standards for the State of California. In accordance with Section 1775 of California Labor Code, Contractor shall pay such penalties and incur such costs as described therein and as are more particularly determined by the Labor Commissioner, in the event of any violation of the foregoing requirement. In addition to the foregoing, Contractor and its subcontractors shall pay to persons employed in the performance of the Services no less than the general prevailing rate of per diem wages for holiday and overtime work fixed as provided in the Labor Code. Copies of the prevailing rate of per diem wages are on file at City's principal office and are available for examination by any interested party on request during normal business hours. Contractor shall keep an accurate payroll record showing the name, address, Social Security number, work classification, straight time and overtime hours worked each day and week, and the actual per diem wages paid to each worker or other employee employed by Contractor.
- 8. Contractor hereby indemnifies, agrees to defend, and holds harmless City, its officers, councilpersons, employees, contractors, and representatives from any and all claims, demands, suits, judgments, liability, damages, costs, and expenses arising in any manner out of this Agreement or occasioned by the performance or attempted performance of the provisions hereof and any act or omission to act on the part of Contractor or Contractor's employees, subcontractors, agents, or representatives.
- 9. In addition to any other method of termination described in this Agreement, City, in its sole and absolute discretion, may terminate this Agreement at any time upon ten (10) days written notice to Contractor. In the event of any such termination and except as otherwise described herein, Contractor shall be entitled to payment for Contractor's performance of its obligations hereunder to the date of termination subject to City's approval and acceptance of Contractor's performance.

City may terminate this Agreement upon twenty-four (24) hours notice to Contractor in the event of Contractor's default hereunder, in which case, Contractor shall not be entitled to payment for any Services which were performed in breach of this Agreement. In addition to City's right to terminate this Agreement due to Contractor's default, City shall have all other remedies available under this Agreement in the event of Contractor's default as well as all remedies available at law or in equity.

- 10. Contractor's Services are utilized by City only for the purpose and to the extent set forth in this Agreement and Contractor's relationship to City shall, during the term of this Agreement, be that of an independent contractor.
- 11. In the performance of its obligations hereunder, Contractor acknowledges that Contractor and Contractor's employees, subcontractors, agents, and representatives may encounter dangerous conditions on the premises where the Services are performed. Contractor for itself and on behalf of its employees, subcontractors, agents, and representatives assumes the risk of same and hereby waives, releases, and forever discharges City, its officers, councilpersons, employees, contractors, agents, and representatives from any and all liability, claims, actions, losses, costs, and expenses arising out of all injuries, and damages which may be suffered by Contractor or Contractor's employees, subcontractors, agents, or representatives including any of same attributable in any way to any act or omission to act or any negligence whatsoever, whether passive or active, by Contractor, or Contractor's officers, employees, subcontractors, agents, or representatives. Contractor represents and warrants that it has read and fully understands the provisions of Section 1542 of the Civil Code of California, which states as follows:

"A general release does not extend to claims which the creditor does not know or suspect to exist in his or her favor at the time of executing the release, which if known by him or her must have materially affected his or her settlement with the debtor."

Contractor, on behalf of itself and its employees, subcontractors, agents, and representatives, hereby expressly waives and releases any right or benefit which each has or may have under Civil Code Section 1542.

- 12. Contractor shall not assign any portion of this Agreement to any other person or entity.
- 13. If any portion of this Agreement shall be considered invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction said invalid portion shall not affect the validity of the remainder of the agreement, and the agreement shall continue in full force and

effect as if the invalid portion had not been included therein.

- 14. Any notice required under this Agreement shall be effective immediately upon personal delivery of same in writing to the party to be noticed or upon deposit in the United States mail, first-class, postage prepaid, addressed as hereinafter described or when sent by facsimile transmission or when sent by electronic mail ("Email"). The following shall be used in providing the foregoing notices: City City Manager, 746 8th Street, Wasco, California 93280, Fax (661) 758-7239, Email—CityClerk@cityofwasco.org; and Contractor —Danielle Dunn, American Enviro Services, INC., 15513 Chateau Montelena Dr, Bakersfield, CA 93314, Phone—(530) 417-5000, Email Danielle AEServices@yahoo.com. Any party may change its address or fax number by giving notice to the other party in the manner herein described.
- 15. If any action is commenced between the parties concerning any provision of this Agreement or the rights and duties of any party in relation thereto or the interpretation of this Agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled, in addition to such other relief as may be granted, to a reasonable sum for the party's attorney fees in such action.
- 16. This Agreement may only be amended by a writing executed by all parties.
- 17. Each party and their respective legal counsel have reviewed this Agreement and agree that this Agreement is the product of negotiations between the parties. This Agreement shall be interpreted without reference to the rule of interpretation of documents that uncertainties or ambiguities therein shall be determined against the party so drafting the Agreement.
- 18. This Agreement contains the entire agreement between the parties with regard to the subject matter herein and supersedes all prior oral and written agreements and understandings between the parties with respect thereto.
- 19. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts. A facsimile or electronic version of this Agreement shall be as effective as the original for all purposes.
- 20. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California.
- 21. Subject to the restrictions on assignment in Paragraph 12, this Agreement shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective heirs, successors, and assigns.

- Waiver by a party of any provision of this Agreement shall not be 22. considered a continuing waiver or a waiver of any other provision, including the time for performance of any such provision.
- 23. Time is of the essence with regard to each covenant, condition, and provision of this Agreement.

Recommendation:

Staff recommends the City Council adopt the resolution authorizing the City Manager or his designee to submit and execute a grant application and any amendments thereto for funding from CalOES Listos California Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Support Grant (LC) Program.

Discussion:

The purpose of the Listos California CERT Support Grant (LC) Program is to provide funding to new and existing CERT programs to support projects that help prepare vulnerable and underserved populations.

Eligibility:

California Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) programs that are registered through the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) website as an existing CERT program, new CERT programs approved by the **California State CERT Administrator**, CERT program Sponsoring Agencies or a fiscal agent representing the CERT program are the only eligible Applicants.

Grant Subaward Performance Period: June 1, 2022 – December 31, 2023

Available Funding:

There is approximately \$500,000 in State General Funds available for the Program. Applicants may apply for up to \$15,000.

The City of Wasco application is requesting \$15,000.00 to implement a new CERT Program with the support and collaboration of the Kern County Fire Department CERT Program.

The project budget includes funds to hire a certified FEMA instructor to provide CERT training based on the 20-hour FEMA curriculum and all hands-on exercises (e.g., fire suppression, earthquake, medical triage), including a disaster simulation drill; it also includes funding to purchase personal protection equipment for our CERT program, background checks, and liability insurance for CERT volunteers.

This project aligns and supports the City's adopted 2020 Kern County Multi-Jurisdiction Hazard Mitigation Plan and Wasco Emergency Response Plan by providing training opportunities to increase preparedness/awareness in our underserved and vulnerable community from high-risk disasters such as earthquakes, flooding, and fires.

Fiscal Impact:

There is no match required for this program.

SUBJECT: Conduct a Public Hearing regarding the Introduction and Overview of the

Redistricting process.

Recommendation:

Staff recommends the City Council receive a report from staff and the redistricting consultant on the redistricting process and permissible criteria to be considered to redraw district boundaries and Conduct a public hearing to receive public input on district boundaries.

Background:

Pursuant to Election Code section 21601, cities with by-district election systems are required to redraw their district boundary maps to ensure compliance with the California and Federal Voting Rights Acts. The process to complete the redistricting requires a minimum of four public hearings and dedicated public outreach to ensure minority populations and communities of interest are aware of the redistricting effort and are provided with options to participate.

Discussion:

Every ten (10) years, cities with by-district election systems must use new census data to review and, if needed, redraw district lines to reflect how local populations have changed. This process, called redistricting, ensures all districts have a nearly equal population. The redistricting process for the City of Wasco must be completed by April 17, 2022.

The City of Wasco adopted its current district boundaries in 2018, based on 2010 census data as required by law. The districts must now be redrawn using the 2020 census data and in compliance with the FAIR MAPS Act, which was adopted by the California legislature as AB 849 and took effect January 1, 2020.

Under the Act, the City Council shall draw and adopt boundaries using the following criteria in the listed order of priority (Elections Code 21621(c)):

- 1. Comply with the federal requirements of equal population and the Voting Rights Act.
- 2. Be geographically contiguous
- 3. Undivided neighborhoods and "communities of interest" (socio-economic geographic areas that should be kept together)
- 4. Display easily identifiable boundaries
- Be compact (do not bypass one group of people to get to a more distant group of people)
- 6. Shall not favor or discriminate against a political party

Once the prioritized criteria are met, other traditional districting principles can be considered, such as:

- 1. Minimize the number of voters delayed from voting in 2022 to 2024
- 2. Respect voters' choices/continuity in office
- 3. Future population growth

By law, the City must hold at least four public hearings that enable community members to provide input on the drawing of district maps:

- At least one hearing must occur before the city or county draws draft maps
- At least two hearings must happen after the drawing of draft maps
- The fourth hearing can happen either before or after the drawing of draft maps
- City staff may hold a public workshop instead of one of the required public redistricting hearings

To increase the accessibility of these hearings, cities, and counties must take the following steps:

- At least one hearing must occur on a Saturday, Sunday, or after 6:00 p.m. on a weekday
- If a redistricting hearing is consolidated with another local government meeting, the redistricting hearing must begin at a pre-designated time
- Local public redistricting hearings must be made accessible to people with disabilities

The purpose of this public hearing is to inform the public about the districting process and to hear from the community on what factors should be taken into consideration while creating district boundaries. The public is requested to provide input regarding communities of interest and other local factors that should be considered while drafting district maps. A community of interest under the relevant Elections Code for cities (Section 21621(c) is, "a population that shares common social or economic interests that should be included within a single district for purposes of its effective and fair representation.

Possible features defining a community of interest might include, but are not limited to:

- 1. School attendance areas;
- 2. Natural dividing lines such as major roads, hills, or highways;
- 3. Areas around parks and other neighborhood landmarks;
- 4. Common issues, neighborhood activities, or legislative/election concerns; and
- 5. Shared demographic characteristics, such as:
 - Similar levels of income, education, or linguistic insolation:

- Languages are spoken at home; and
- Single-family and multi-family housing unit areas.

The city will have an online mapping tool that the resident will be able to use to submit their input on the drawing of the district lines. In this meeting, the Consultant will demonstrate how to utilize the online mapping tool.

Fiscal Impact:

The City Council approved the cost for the redistricting consulting services on January 25, 2022. No budget action is required.

SUBJECT: Approval of Water Operator I reclassification to Water Operator II for the

Fiscal Year 2021-2022 in support of strategic planning.

Recommendation:

Staff recommends Water Operator I reclassification approval to Operator II for the Fiscal Year 2021-2022 in support of strategic planning.

Discussion:

The Public Works Department would like to reclassify the Water Operator I to a Water Operator II for logistical reasons. The City has budgeted and recruited for a Utility Technician and a Water Operator I but has yet to fill the positions. Currently, the City has one approved Water Operator I position. Still, after much consideration and strategic analysis, it has been determined that it is in the City's best interest to migrate towards a career growth model.

The Water Operator I position is limited in certain areas such as operating and making chemical adjustments at Water well locations on their own. However, with additional training and experience, an Operator II can operate and make the necessary adjustments to pumping rates, chemical feed equipment, and SCADA control with no supervision and can serve as a lead operator when the supervisor is away. With the increasing work load and the restart of water shutoffs on the horizon it has been proposed to recruit for the position of Water Operator II to assist the Public Works Department to provide greater water service by bringing in a staff member who will hold the certificates and experience necessary to make a positive impact to City services and functions immediately.

Fiscal Impact:

There is no fiscal impact for the fiscal year 2021-2022 because of several months of staffing vacancies in the water department. The proposed position will be budgeted for the fiscal year 2022-2023.

Recommendation:

Staff recommends that the City Council adopt a resolution approving the mid-year operating budget adjustments totaling \$186,900 in the General Fund and \$964,837 in other funds, and Establishing the American Rescue Plan Act Special Revenue Fund.

Background:

The purpose of this report is to present the financial condition of the General Fund at the mid-point of the fiscal year and revised projections at year-end (Attachment 1); and propose budget adjustments as needed based on issues that have surfaced since budget adoption (Attachment 2).

The following Mid-Year Budget Review covers the first six months of the 2021-22 fiscal year from July 1, 2021 through December 31, 2021. Typically, most attention is paid to major operating funds, such as the General Fund, Water, Sanitation, and Wastewater Enterprise funds. The three largest and most vital revenue sources for the General Fund are Property Tax, Sales Tax, Measure X, and Motor Vehicle License Fees In Lieu of Property tax

The major takeaway is that the City remains on good financial footing at mid-year, with a continued focus on strategic one-time uses of higher than anticipated sales tax, however, impacts from inflation are beginning to be felt in every operation of the City, including utility enterprise operations, that will put pressure on budgets for the remainder of the fiscal year and planning for next year. As the pandemic transitions to endemic status in 2022, staff will be monitoring economic conditions carefully, continuing to focus on building reserves for an uncertain future and maintaining essential services to the community.

Discussion:

Key Findings. On a positive note, while still down from pre-COVID levels in many cases, key General Fund revenues are performing on target with projections included in the adopted 2021-22 Budget. The fund balance of \$5.1 million at the end of the year, which is 42% of operating expenditures compared with the City's minimum policy of 35% is an indicator that the city is able to meet operating costs for the three months.

The Road Ahead. While the General Fund is in satisfactory fiscal condition in the short term, significant fiscal challenges are ahead of us with other cost pressures due to unfunded pension and likely higher public safety and fire contract cost increases from Kern County due to these same pressures.

General Fund Fiscal Review

Attachment 1 presents an analysis of General Fund revenues ("Top 10," which excludes one-time grants, account for 90% of total revenues), expenditures and changes in fund balance. It presents actual results for the last two completed fiscal years (2019-20 and 2020-21) and year-to-date for 2021-22 through December 31, 2021. It then shows the current budget, revised year-end projections and the variance.

Revenues. The following is a summary of key variances.

- Property tax (general and VLF in Lieu). Based on apportionment factors set by the State, both of these revenues are collected on the property tax and driven based on assessed valuation. Typically, changes in assessed value are slow to react to economic factors, up or down. The first major apportionment of 2021-22 taxes occurred in December 2021 and thus far collections are on target with our projections.
- Sales tax (general and Measure X). Based on year-to-date results, General and Measure X sales tax revenues appear to be performing slightly below estimates; however, the City has yet to receive the November and December monthly payments from the State of California. We anticipate that our revenues will be on target once these payments are received.
- Transient occupancy tax (TOT). Visitors to Wasco who stay in the City's hotels, motels and inns for a period of less than thirty consecutive calendar days pay TOT. Quarterly TOT payments are due within 30 days after the end of the quarter. Based on year-to-date results, TOT appears to be performing slightly below estimates; however, we have yet to receive any second-quarter payments as of the date of this report. We anticipate that our revenues will be on target once these payments are received.
- **Development review fees and permits.** This revenue is mainly comprised of fees for planning and engineering services and building permits. We will continue to monitor these revenues as they appear to be performing slightly below projections.
- **Grants.** The significant variance between fiscal year 2020-2021 Actual to fiscal year 2021-2022 is primarily due to the expected combined grant revenue and payment(s) from the State totaling \$9,300,000 to assist the City with the former farm labor complex demolition and site clean-up. (This also explains why year-to-date actual CIP expenditures are much lower than the budget.) The City will not proceed with this project until this payment is received. In addition, there are several grant-funded capital projects that were budgeted in the current fiscal year, but have yet to commence.

Expenditures. These are based on the current budget plus the proposed budget adjustments. The basis for these adjustments is discussed below.

Other Sources and Uses. This category reflects transfers from other funds,

Ending Fund Balance. After assigning \$9.3 million for the labor housing complex grant revenue contingency, the ending unassigned fund balance is \$5.1 million at the end of the year, which is 42% of operating expenditures compared with the City's minimum policy of 35%.

The table above displays a comparison between the actual to budget figures as of 12/31/2021 for the Wastewater Fund as well as a percentage difference between budget and actual. At the bottom, the anticipated Surplus or Deficit is displayed as a positive (favorable) or negative (unfavorable). Please note that the Wastewater Fund Capital costs are included in these figures. The table above excludes any proposed midyear adjustments.

Expenses are tracking at 38% thus far through the year, which appears lower than expected mainly due to the timing of capital projects. Revenues are roughly 58% which is slightly above where the Wastewater Fund is at this time of the year. This slight increase is most likely due to the updated farm lease agreement for the fiscal year 2021-22. We also want to point out carryover balances that rolled forward from the prior fiscal year totaling an additional \$236,906 in expenditures not reflected on the table above.

This fund is, however, anticipated to in an operational deficit (spending more than it earns) as capital projects commence. The Wastewater Fund appears to have healthy reserves at the moment to offset the cost of needed capital improvement for current user demands. However, the overall health of this fund would need to be further analyzed if the City aggressively pursues expansion of its industrial and commercial footprint.

The table above displays a comparison between the actual to budget figures as of 12/31/2021 for the Water Fund as well as a percentage difference between budget and actual. At the bottom, the anticipated Surplus or Deficit is displayed as a positive (favorable) or negative (unfavorable). Please note that the Water Fund Capital costs are included in these figures. The table above excludes any adjustments.

Expenses are tracking at 24% thus far through the year, which is about where staff anticipates this should be given the large capital allocation to acquire land for the replacement aged water wells. In addition to land acquisitions, the fund experienced numerous vacancies due to retirement. As a result, personnel costs were impacted. In addition to the capital projects, staffing vacancies, the fund is also dealing with the COVID pandemic impacts. We also want to point out carryover balances that rolled forward from the prior fiscal year totaling an additional \$3,147,633 in expenditures not reflected on the table above.

Revenues are roughly 62% which is slightly above of where the Water Fund is at this time of the year. This is directly linked to the hot summer months, where water consumption was higher compared to prior summer months. The second contributor of the 64% were two ladder CDs that matured September 2021, resulting in higher interest income.

This fund is, however, anticipated to be in an operational deficit (spending more than it earns) as properties are acquired, and vacant positions are filled. The last rate increase happened in 2016. The cost to deliver water services has increased substantially from 2016 to now, but rates have remained constant for six years. The fund spends its precious cash needed for capital, emergency operations, and any other unexpected expenses to keep day-to-day operations afloat. This is an unhealthy practice that has been magnified by the pandemic economic impacts.

The table below illustrates on an "order of magnitude" the anticipated capital costs required to replace four aged wells that have exceeded their useful life. Unfortunately, the fund is unable to sustain a \$25,000,000 infrastructure replacement. However, the City is aggressively pursuing grant funding from the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) to fund these capital needs. But, in order to attain the funding, the SWRCB must ensure that the City repays the low-interest loan from a steady stream of revenue. As such, rates must reflect the repayment of the loan over 20-30 years.

The table above displays a comparison between the actual to budget figures as of 12/31/2021 for the Sanitation Fund as well as a percentage difference between budget and actual. At the bottom, the anticipated Surplus or Deficit is displayed as a positive (favorable) or negative (unfavorable). Please note that the Sanitation Fund Capital costs are included in these figures. The table above excludes any adjustments.

Expenses are tracking at 36% thus far through the year, which is about where staff anticipates this should be given the large capital allocation to purchase refuse trucks. Unfortunately, the City was not able to purchase last fiscal year the trucks due to manufacturing delays, rising costs of steel and disruption in the supply chain at the ports resulting in backlogs across the nation. Another factor that has played a role in the low percentage of operation cast at the midpoint of the fiscal year has been staffing shortages. In addition to the capital projects and staffing vacancies, the COVID pandemic impacts are still affecting this fund. We also want to point out carryover balances that rolled forward from the prior fiscal year totaling an additional \$773,000 in expenditures not reflected on the table above.

Revenues are roughly 52% which is above of where the Sanitation Fund is at this time of the year. This is most likely due to State and Federal utility billing assistance and two ladder CD's that matured September 2021, resulting in higher interest income.

This fund is, however, anticipated to still be in an operational deficit (spending more than it earns) as cost continued to increase coupled by State Mandates effective January 01,2022. The last rate increase happened in 2016. The cost to deliver Sanitation services

has increased substantially from 2016 to 2022, but rates have remained the same for six years. The fund spends its precious cash needed for capital, emergency operations, and any other unexpected expenses to keep day-to-day operations afloat. This is an unhealthy practice that has been magnified by the pandemic economic impacts.

Increases in cost can be attributed to rising inflation and increases in the minimum wage from 2016 to 2022. The State is Mandating recycling of recyclables and organics in addition to significant reportings to ensure Cities are complying with SB 1383. The State has a goal of reducing Landfill Organic Waste by 20% by 2020, reducing Landfill Organic Waste by 75% by 2025, and also increasing 20% of edible food recovery by 2025.

R3 Consulting conducted an extensive rate study and the impacts of SB 1383, which started in September of 2020. The findings include:

Current Revenues do not Cover Expenses

Fiscal Year (FY) 21/22 revenues are projected to be approximately \$3.1 million. Total expenses are projected at approximately \$4.0 million, resulting in a FY deficit of approximately \$900,000 (30% revenue shortfall).

• The Sanitation Enterprise Fund has Significant Operating Reserves

- At the end of FY 20/21 the Sanitation Enterprise Fund had \$3.4 million in operating reserves (unrestricted fund balance); 85% of total projected FY expenses vs. 17% 25% target.
- While the Division entered FY 21-22 with a healthy operating reserve balance of \$3.4 million, without a rate adjustment, that reserve will be completely exhausted within two years if the City does nothing.
- The Vehicle Fleet Is Old and Many Vehicles Need to be Replaced
 - At an average annual cost of ~500K annually over the next 10 years
- The City's Residential Rate is Higher than the Regional Average Additional revenues are needed to:
 - o Offset 30% FY 21/22 revenue shortfall
 - o Provide for necessary vehicle replacement
 - o Add additional required residential and commercial services
 - Comply with SB 1383 edible food recovery, recovered material procurement, and other requirements

Residential rates are subsidizing commercial rates

- o Residential revenues account for 65% of revenues and 53% of expenses
- o Commercial revenues account for 35% of revenues and 47% of expenses

Staff has recommended revisiting outsourcing inquiries during Fiscal Year 2022 -2023.

AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT

The American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) of 2021 was signed into law on March 11, 2021. The Act provides \$65.1 billing to 19,000 units of state, local and tribal governments nationwide using a block grant formula. The City of Wasco will receive a total of \$6,868,042. The City has received \$3,434,021 in July 2021. Per the legislation, the City may use these funds for the following purposes:

- Replace lost public sector revenue, using this funding to provide government services up to the amount of revenue lost due to the pandemic.
- Respond to the far-reaching public health and negative economic impacts of the pandemic, by supporting the health of communities, and helping households, small

- businesses, impacted industries, nonprofits, and the public sector recover from economic impacts.
- Provide premium pay for essential workers, offering additional support to those who have and will bear the greatest health risks because of their service in critical sectors.
- Invest in water, sewer, and broadband infrastructure, making necessary investments to improve access to clean drinking water, to support vital wastewater and stormwater infrastructure, and to expand affordable access to broadband internet

Due to the one-time nature of this grant funding, Staff is recommending that these funds be used to offset one-time eligible costs. In addition, although not required, it is strongly recommended that the City establish a special revenue fund to segregate these funds from other City operations and account for eligible expenditures. The City has until December 31, 2024 to incur eligible costs; however, due to the ongoing nature of the pandemic and its negative impacts, it is imperative that the City gets started on implementing projects and programs to spend the funding. At the moment, City Council has approved the use of ARPA funds on essential worker premium pay which is reflected in the proposed midyear budget adjustments.

FISCAL IMPACT

The recommended adjustments totaling \$1,151,737 will result in an additional impact to the fund balances of the funds mentioned above.

SECTION 3: That the City Council of the City of Wasco accepts the mid-year financial report outlined as detailed in Exhibit A, and directs the Finance Director to incorporate these amendments into the 2021-2022 annual budget.
