Recommendation:

Background:

This report is prepared and presented to the City Manager and City Council pursuant to the City's Investment Policy requirements and the California Government Code. The City's investment policy requires the Treasurer or Chief Fiscal Officer to render monthly investment reports to the City Manager and the City Council and requires certain information about the City's investments to be presented in the report and that the report contains statements that:

- 1) The City is in compliance with its investment policy; and
- 2) The City is able to meet its expenditure requirements for the following six (6) months or provide an explanation of why sufficient funds will or may not be available.

The City's investment strategy continues to prioritize its investment opportunities on the following; in order of importance:

- 1) Safety;
- 2) Liquidity; and
- 3) Yield

This strategy is consistent with the Government Code and stresses keeping the citizens' funds safe and available for operations rather than attempting to maximize returns by making riskier investments.

The Finance Department has prepared the Investment Report for the month ending June 30, 2022. This report meets the latest requirements of the City's Investment Policy as presented to the City Council on June 16, 2020, as well as Government Code Section 53646.

Discussion:

The City's total cash and investments market value on July 31, 2022, was \$57,810,880 compared to \$54,384,491 on June 30, 2022. This is a \$3.42 million increase from the previous month (\$3.47 million increase on the cost basis).

The increase is primarily driven by the second tranche of the America Rescue Plan Act deposit.

As of July 31, 2022, the City has \$45.9 million (79.43%) of its Cash and Investment Portfolio held in the State of California Local Agency Investment Fund ("LAIF"), which earned 0.86% during the quarter (ended June 30, 2022). This earnings rate exceeded the short-term benchmark. Other cash pools held a combined \$6.9 million (12.07%) of the City's Cash and Investment Portfolio. The City also has \$1.5 million (2.65% of its Portfolio) held by UnionBanc Investment Services ("UBIS") and invested, pursuant to City instructions, in Certificates of Deposit and Governmental Securities with a Money Market account being used to maximize returns on otherwise idle cash.

The metrics used in the attached report are based on Securities issued by the United States Government. The short-term benchmark of .30 % is the average earned by a 3-month Treasury Bill during the month ended July 31, 2022, and the long and medium-term benchmark of .86 % is the average earnings of 2-year and 3-year treasury notes during that time frame. Lastly, the one-year U.S Treasury benchmark for the month ended July 31, 2022, was .69%.

All the information presented in this report is consistent with the disclosures included in the City's Audited Financial Statements previously presented to the City Council.

Fiscal Impact:

There is no fiscal impact to this action.

Background:

This report is prepared and presented to the City Manager and City Council pursuant to the City's Investment Policy requirements and the California Government Code. The City's investment policy requires the Treasurer or Chief Fiscal Officer to render monthly investment reports to the City Manager and the City Council and requires certain information about the City's investments to be presented in the report and that the report contains statements that:

- 1) The City is in compliance with its investment policy; and
- 2) The City is able to meet its expenditure requirements for the following six (6) months or provide an explanation of why sufficient funds will or may not be available.

The City's investment strategy continues to prioritize its investment opportunities on the following; in order of importance:

- 1) Safety;
- 2) Liquidity; and
- 3) Yield

This strategy is consistent with the Government Code and stresses keeping the citizens' funds safe and available for operations rather than attempting to maximize returns by making riskier investments.

The Finance Department has prepared the Investment Report for the month ended June 30, 2022. This report meets the latest requirements of the City's Investment Policy as presented to the City Council on June 16, 2020, as well as Government Code Section 53646.

Discussion:

The City's total cash and investments market value on August 31, 2022, was \$57,646,622 compared to \$57,810,880 on June 30, 2022. This is a \$163,216 decrease from the previous month (\$212,278 decrease on the cost basis).

The decrease is attributed to several external and internal factors as the volatility with the Feds increasing interest rates to maintain inflation under control and payments to contractors for street projects and fleet purchases.

As of August 31, 2022, the City has \$46 million (79.83%) of its Cash and Investment Portfolio held in the State of California Local Agency Investment Fund ("LAIF"), which earned 0.75% during the quarter (ended June 30, 2022). This earnings rate exceeded the short-term benchmark. Other cash pools held a combined \$6.9 million (12.03%) of the City's Cash and Investment Portfolio. The City also has \$1.5 million (2.66% of its Portfolio) held by UnionBanc Investment Services ("UBIS") and invested, pursuant to City instructions, in Certificates of Deposit and Governmental Securities with a Money Market account being used to maximize returns on otherwise idle cash.

The metrics used in the attached report are based on Securities issued by the United States Government. The short-term benchmark of .41 % is the average earned by a 3-month Treasury Bill during the month ended July 31, 2022, and the long and medium-term benchmark of .95 % is the average earnings of 2-year and 3-year treasury notes during that time frame. Lastly, the one-year U.S Treasury benchmark for the month ended August 31, 2022, was .58%.

All the information presented in this report is consistent with the disclosures included in the City's Audited Financial Statements previously presented to the City Council.

There is no fiscal impact to this action.

Recommendation:

Staff recommends City Council adopt a resolution authorizing the City Manager or his designee to approve a purchase order in the amount of \$11,637.12 to purchase one sludge roll-off bin.

Discussion:

Currently, the Wastewater Department has deteriorating sludge roll-off bins that are in need of replacement. This affects daily operations when a bin is down for maintenance and repairs, and biosolids are not able to be produced. The Wastewater Department will utilize this new roll-off bin for biosolids disposal, repairs, and rehabilitation of existing bins.

In accordance with the City's municipal code, the City may utilize joint powers agreements to procure equipment. The City is a member of Sourcewell. Sourcewell is a national joint power agreement that allows the City to make equipment purchases without further competitive bidding. The City will be obtaining the bin using CONFAB Sourcewell Contract No. 041621-WQI.

Fiscal Impact:

The City budgeted \$15,000 in the 2022-23 budget for a replacement sludge bin for the Wastewater Department. The funding source for this project is out of the wastewater capital outlay fund. The bin cost is \$11,637.12.

Recommendation:

Staff recommends authorizing the City to implement teleconference public meetings pursuant to Assembly Bill AB 361, allowing the City to continue a hybrid virtual meeting environment.

Backaround:

Over the past year, meetings of the City's legislative bodies have been held with virtual teleconference components. On September 16, 2021, Governor Newsom signed Assembly Bill ("AB") 361, which allows cities to continue to meet remotely during proclaimed states of emergency under modified Ralph M. Brown Act requirements that are similar but not identical to the rules and procedures established by the previous Executive Orders temporarily suspending provisions of the Brown Act. On September 20, 2021, Governor Newsom signed Executive Order N-15-21 to suspend AB 361 until October 1, 2021.

AB 361, until January 1, 2024, would authorize a local agency to use teleconferencing without complying with the teleconferencing requirements imposed by the Brown Act when a local legislative body holds a meeting during a declared state of emergency by the Governor and when a state or local health officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing.

Discussion:

On June 11, 2021, Governor Newsom issued Executive Order N-08-21, which among other things, rescinded his prior Executive Order N-29-20 and set a date of October 1, 2021, for public agencies to transition back to public meetings held in full compliance with the Brown Act.

As the virus continues to periodically surge in California, the goal of AB 361 is "to improve and enhance public access to local agency meetings during the COVID-19 pandemic

and future applicable emergencies, by allowing broader access through teleconferencing options," consistent with Executive Order N-29-20. AB 361 contains an urgency clause which became effective upon signing with a sunset of January 1, 2024. AB 361 also provides that if a local agency conducts teleconference meetings in reliance on AB 361, the local agency must make the following findings by majority vote every 30 days to continue using the bill's exemption to the Brown Act teleconferencing rules:

- •The legislative body has reconsidered the circumstances of the emergency; and
 - Either of the following circumstances exists: The state of emergency continues to directly impact the ability of members to meet safely in person, or State or local officials continue to impose or recommend social distancing measures.

Staff recommends adopting the resolution to authorize the implementation of teleconferencing public meetings.

RESOLUTION NO. 2022 -

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WASCO TO IMPLEMENT TELECONFERENCING REQUIREMENTS DURING A PROCLAIMED STATE OF EMERGENCY FOR ALL CITY COUNCIL, COMMITTEE, COMMISSION, BOARD, AND OTHER CITY MEETINGS PURSUANT TO ASSEMBLY BILL 361

WHEREAS, the Ralph M. Brown Act requires that all meetings of a legislative body of a local agency be open and public and that any person may attend and participate in such meetings; and

WHEREAS, the Brown Act allows for legislative bodies to hold meetings by teleconference but imposes specific requirements for doing so; and

WHEREAS, on March 4, 2020, the Governor issued a proclamation declaring a state of emergency due to the COVID-19 pandemic pursuant to Government Code 8625, and this proclaimed state of emergency currently remains in effect; and

WHEREAS, on March 17, 2020, in order to address the need for public meetings during the present public health emergency, Governor Newsom issued Executive Order No. N-29-20, suspending the Act's teleconferencing requirements; and

WHEREAS, on June 11, 2021, Governor Newsom issued Executive Order No. N-08-21, continuing the suspension of the Brown Act's teleconferencing requirements through September 30, 2021; and

WHEREAS, these Executive Orders allowed legislative bodies to meet virtually as long as certain notice and accessibility requirements were met; and

WHEREAS, on September 16, 2021, the Governor signed Assembly Bill No. 361 (A.B. 361 – Government Code section 54953) that went into effect on October 1, 2021, which amended the Brown Act so that a local agency may use teleconferencing without complying with the regular teleconferencing requirements of the Act, where the legislative body holds a meeting during a proclaimed state of emergency and makes certain findings; and

WHEREAS, Government Code section 54953 requires that the legislative body make additional findings every 30 days in order to continue such teleconferencing; and

WHEREAS, state and local officials continue to impose and recommend measures to promote social distancing, and because of the ongoing threat of COVID-19, meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health and safety of attendees; and

WHEREAS, teleconferencing ensures the health and safety of the public, the legislative bodies of the city, and City staff while allowing regularly-scheduled meetings to occur without interruption due to COVID-19.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Wasco as follows:

SECTION 1: That the foregoing recitals are true and correct and incorporates them by this reference.

SECTION 2: That the City Council finds, by a majority vote, the following:

- The City Council has reconsidered the circumstances of the state of emergency; and
- b. Any of the following circumstances exist:
 - 1. The state of emergency continues to directly impact the ability of the members to meet safely in person.
 - 2. State or local officials continue to impose or recommend measures to promote social distancing.
 - 3. As a result of the emergency, meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees

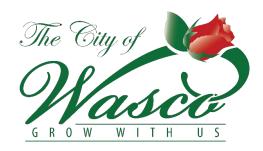
SECTION 3: That this Resolution to implement teleconferencing pursuant to Government Code section 54953(e) applies to the City Council and all committees, commissions, boards, and other City meetings ("other legislative bodies") of the City of Wasco based upon the findings listed above.

SECTION 4: That the City Manager or the City Manager's designee is authorized to take all steps and perform all actions necessary to execute and implement this Resolution in compliance with Government Code section 54953.

SECTION 5: That this Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and remain in effect for 30 days or until such time as the City Council adopts a subsequent resolution in accordance with Government Code section 54953(e)(3) to extend the time during which the City Council and all other legislative bodies of the City of Wasco may continue to teleconference without compliance with Government Code section 54953(b)(3).

Recommendation:

Staff recommends City Council adopt a resolution authorizing the City Manager or his designee to approve a purchase order in the amount of \$29,798.37 to purchase one Ford Ranger truck.

Discussion:

Currently, the Water Department has four larger service trucks to use when performing job duties around the city. This Is very inefficient due to the gas mileage the service trucks get and the cost of fuel. The Water Department will utilize this new smaller utility vehicle mostly for collecting meter reads and customer complaints, but also potentially for out-of-town training. This will allow the Department to use much less fuel than by using their service truck for tasks that do not require it.

In accordance with the City's municipal code, the City may utilize joint powers agreements to procure equipment. The City is a member of Sourcewell. Sourcewell is a national joint power agreement that allows the City to make equipment purchases without further competitive bidding. The City will be obtaining the truck using Sourcewell Contract No. 091521-NAF.

Fiscal Impact:

The City budgeted \$162,000 in the 2022-23 budget (Project No. 22005) for two vehicles, one of which is a smaller utility vehicle for the Water Department. The funding for this truck is out of the Water enterprise fund. The truck cost is \$29,798.37 leaving \$132,201.63 to purchase the other vehicle specified in that Project Budget.

\$25,000.00.

Recommendation:

Staff recommends adopting a resolution for the award of a consulting contract with KSI Engineering, Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$100,620.00 and allow the City Manager or his Designee to execute Contract Change Orders in an amount not to exceed an aggregate of \$25,000.00.

Background:

The City has received State funding with a Clean California Grant for fully rehabilitating the Historic Downtown area. This Project will consist of installing energy-conserving lighting, planting low water use plants and trees, improved seating areas, new bins for proper waste disposal, public art installation in (4) pedestrian alleys, play equipment, using QR Codes for digital wayfinding, improvements to pedestrian alleys and walkways, public parking lots, new green space/plaza, and upgrades to the existing 7th Street Park. Awarding this contract for the final project design is the first step in the process towards bidding and constructing this project.

Discussion:

The Project RFP was advertised on July 1, 2022. On August 5, 2022, the City of Wasco received one proposal from the following Consultant:

FIRM

KSI Engineering, Inc.

Following State guidelines, Staff conducted a review of the consultant's Proposal followed by an oral interview with a Q&A session. Via approved evaluation methods Staff, determined that KSI Engineering, Inc. is a qualified consultant to do the Project design.

Prior to recommending the award, Staff spoke with the State to inform them of our intentions to move forward with the proposal. Per their recommendation, Staff filled out a Public Interest Finding form due to only receiving one proposal. This form clearly lays out the justification for the City selecting the Consultant without competition. This form has been attached here for clarity and transparency.

Fiscal Impact:

The City had budgeted \$831,443.00 for the design of this Project. At the time of the consultant's proposal, the City had already conducted a full topographic survey and developed numerous conceptual designs, allowing this design cost to come in significantly below budget. The price proposed by the Consultant is not to exceed \$100,620.00, which is well within our budget; even considering an additional \$25,000.00 allowed for the City manager to approve if any issues are uncovered that will require additional design throughout the process.

Consultant shall be paid upon completion of the Milestone Services to the reasonable satisfaction of City and upon presentation of an invoice upon completion of the Services (the "Invoice"). The Invoice shall describe the Services performed and such other information as reasonably required by City. The Invoice shall first be reviewed by the City Manager or the City Manager's representative and approved for payment. 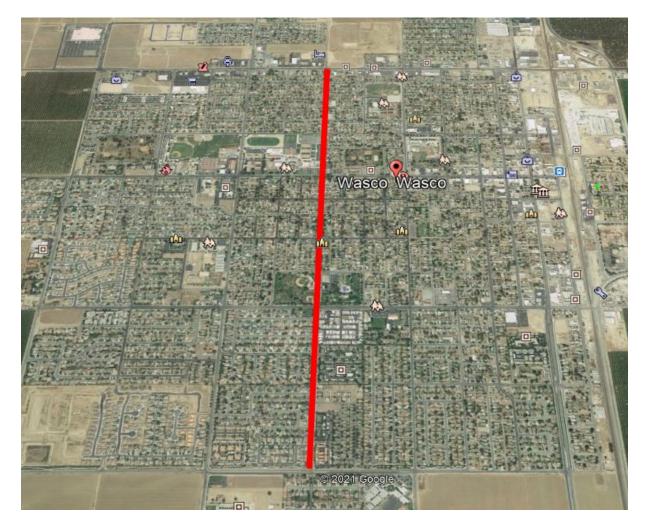

Staff recommends City Council adopt a resolution authorizing the City Manager to Sign and Execute a task order with BHT Engineering to prepare Plans and specifications for our 2022-23 SB1 Project for the Rehabilitation of Poplar Avenue.

Discussion:

On May 17, 2022, the City Council approved our allocation of SB1 funds to be utilized on the road rehabilitation of Poplar Avenue between Highway 46 and Filburn Avenue. This Project will address various locations of concern in order to enhance both pedestrian and vehicle facilities along the roadway. In addition, the segments that will be improved will tie into segments of two other Projects that were completed with SB1 funds in past years.



BHT Engineering is serving as the City's current engineer. They have provided a proposal to perform the services, and the costs exceed \$10,000; therefore, it requires the City Council's approval. Staff is requesting that the City Manager be authorized to execute Task Order #21 with BHT Engineering to complete the design and development of specifications for the 2022-23 SB1 project. Attached to this staff report is a proposal for design of plans and specification development. The task order will be paid on a time and materials basis in an amount not to exceed \$67,960.00.

Fiscal Impact:

Project No. 21016 in the 2022-23 FY Capital Improvement Plan budgeted \$500,000.00 for Construction and design. The Design segment of the Project was expected to be \$45,000.00. Due to the number of ADA ramps to be designed, BHT expects to spend some additional time on site to develop their plans, which will cost a bit more than anticipated.

Not exceeding \$67,960.00 will leave us with \$432,040.00 for Construction. Note that the \$67,960.00 is not to be exceeded and will likely be under this amount. Staff expects the remaining \$432,040.00 to be enough to allow for construction to take place.

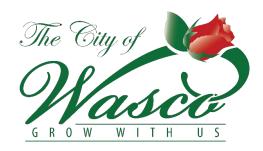

Discussion:

The 2022-23 FY Capital Improvement Plan Project No. 20214 emphasizes installing street lighting City-Wide. The first area identified was $1^{st} - 5^{th}$ Streets between Birch Avenue and Poplar Avenue due to the lack of existing lighting on these streets and the close proximity to schooling.

The staff has obtained PGE designs and approval and installed a conduit from the power pole to a pull box which will act as the source point to power the lights going down each street. While we wait for PG&E to energize these locations, the next step is obtaining a utility design for the conduit and light pole locations and sizing the conductors that will run down each street.

BHT Engineering is serving as the City's current engineer. They have provided a proposal to perform the design services, and the costs exceed \$10,000; therefore, they require City Council approval. Staff is requesting that the City Manager be authorized to execute Task Order #22 with BHT Engineering to complete the design and development of specifications for the Street Lighting Project. Attached to this staff report is a proposal for design for plans and specification development. The task order will be paid on a time and materials basis in an amount not to exceed \$39,495.00

Fiscal Impact:

Project No. 20214 in the 2022-23 FY Capital Improvement Plan budgeted \$47,500 in prior years and \$50,000 in this fiscal year for design totaling \$97,500 currently available for design. BHT has quoted the Design segment of this Project not to exceed \$39,495.00, which leaves us \$58,005.00 remaining in the design budget.

Recommendation:

Staff recommends City Council adopt a resolution authorizing the City Manager or his designee to approve a purchase order in the amount of \$32,139.17 to purchase one Ford Ranger truck.

Discussion:

Currently the Wastewater Department has one service truck and one pickup to use when performing job duties around the city. This affects daily operations when a vehicle is down for maintenance or someone needs to make a trip to the surrounding areas. The Wastewater Department will utilize this new smaller utility vehicle mostly for inspecting lift stations, customer complaints, but also for out of town commutes. This Smaller utility vehicle will allow the Department to use much less fuel than using one of the larger trucks for tasks that do not require it.

In accordance with the City's municipal code, the City may utilize joint powers agreements, to procure equipment. The City is a member of Sourcewell. Sourcewell is a national joint power agreement that allows the City to make equipment purchases without further competitive bidding. The City will be obtaining the truck using Sourcewell Contract No. 091521-NAF.

Fiscal Impact:

The City budgeted \$103,500 in the 2022-23 budget (Project No. 23017) for two vehicles, one of which is a smaller utility truck for the Wastewater Department. The funding source for this project is out of the wastewater enterprise fund. The Truck cost is \$32,139.17 leaving \$71,360.83 to purchase the other vehicle specified in that Project Budget.

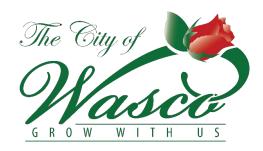

execute a contract with Aspect Engineering in the amount of \$85,884.00 and Authorize the use of \$100,000 of ARPA funds to cover costs associated with upgrading the City of Wasco's Water Utilities Supervisory, Control, and

Data Acquisition (SCADA) system.

Recommendation:

Adopt a Resolution Authorizing the City Manager or his designee fully execute a contract with Aspect Engineering in the amount of \$85,884.00 and Authorize the use of \$100,000 of ARPA funds to cover costs associated with upgrading the City of Wasco's Water Utilities Supervisory, Control, and Data Acquisition (SCADA) system.

Discussion:

The City of Wasco's SCADA system was first installed in 1998, which at the time, completely changed the way that our water Utilities were able to respond to and mitigate water and wastewater issues and emergencies. The SCADA system currently has supervisory control of The Potable Water System, including six municipal well sites and the Wastewater Treatment Facility Lift Stations (low points of the Sanitary Sewer System). The SCADA system allows supervisory control of flows, pumping speeds, alarm alerts with reset capability, power outages, liquid levels, chlorine residual, etc. With future development and expansion of our Wastewater and Fresh Water Systems, an upgraded system is warranted to expand the monitoring and control of the many aspects of the systems. This is achieved by ensuring the availability of good water quality and mitigating situations before they are a risk to the community and environment.

With continued growth, components will be added to our Wastewater and Potable water systems in the upcoming years, Including new well sites, storage tanks, and 123 TCP treatment. This upgrade will allow us to prepare for future expansion to be connected to the SCADA system and optimize control of the existing utilities that are currently connected.

After seeing demonstrations of various SCADA platforms, Aspect Engineering stood out; this provider has a strong service relationship throughout Kern County with multiple large

clients in similar industries (Cal Water, City of Delano Water and Wastewater Utilities, and Arvin-Edison Water Storage District.) The \$85,884.00 quoted by Aspect Engineering will cover the cost of software and integration of Rockwell Automation's FactoryTalk SE as the SCADA platform for our drinking water system. This platform will allow us to integrate the wastewater treatment facility and other infrastructure in the future at additional costs. CB Pacific and Agilitech also provided demonstrations. CB Pacific offers GE Digitals IFIX products, leaving us to contact a third party for integration. Agilitech is our current SCADA provider and currently does not provide the reliable support needed for a growing Water/Wastewater utility.

ARPA Fiscal Recovery Funds

From a policy perspective, the Fiscal Recovery Funds are intended to:

- Support urgent COVI D-19 response efforts to continue to decrease the spread of the virus and bring the pandemic under control;
- Replace lost revenue for the eligible state, local, territorial, and Tribal governments to strengthen support for vital public services and help retain jobs;
- Support immediate economic stabilization for households and businesses;
- Address systemic public health and economic challenges that have contributed to the unequal impact of the pandemic.

From an operational standpoint, funds may be used:

- To respond to the public health emergency or its negative economic impacts, including assistance to households, small businesses, and nonprofits, or aid to impacted industries such as tourism, travel, and hospitality;
- To respond to workers performing essential work during the COVID-19 public health emergency by providing premium pay to eligible workers;
- For the provision of government services to the extent of the reduction in revenue due to the COVID-19 public health emergency relative to revenues collected in the most recent full fiscal year prior to the emergency;
- To make necessary investments in water, sewer, or broadband infrastructure.

The Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds provide flexibility for each government to meet local needs-including support for households, small businesses, impacted industries, essential workers, and the communities hardest hit by the crisis. These funds can also be used to make necessary investments in water, sewer, and broadband infrastructure.

The U.S. Department of the Treasury has published an Interim Final Rule (IFR) that implements the provisions of this program. The staff has reviewed the document, conferred with staff in surrounding cities, and reviewed existing budget/project priorities to develop a proposed plan for just over half of Wasco's Local Fiscal Recovery Funds, detailed below.

Cyber Security (SCADA) WTR/WW

SCADA cybersecurity involves taking deliberate actions to safeguard the industrial control system against outside threats, hackers, malware, and more. Common SCADA cybersecurity processes involve establishing basic security and monitoring systems that dynamically alert operators on changes to the system in real-time. The SCADA system remotely monitors equipment and processes for our fresh water system and wastewater treatment plant.

<u>Timeline & Reporting for the use of Fiscal Recovery Funds</u>

The current regulations from the U.S. Treasury permit the funds to be used to cover costs incurred beginning on March 3, 2021. All funds must be obligated to their specific use by December 31, 2024, and fully expended by December 31, 2026.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The appropriation of ARPA Fiscal Recovery Funds will not adversely impact existing City funds, operations, or budgeted programs and projects. Fiscal Recovery Funds will have a significant positive effect on furthering existing policy priorities of improving the City's water system, including addressing deferred water system maintenance and retaining committed and qualified City staff who have diligently served the community of Wasco from the COVID-19 pandemic.

From a cashflow standpoint, although the ARPA Fiscal Recovery funds received to date (100%), the timeline of most of the proposed projects will stretch into the next calendar year, so it is unlikely that the fund established for ARPA funds will ever go into a negative status.

Recommendation:

Discussion:

Currently the City of Wasco has 6 active well sites to meet the City's water demands. As of June of 2022, water quality issues have arisen with well 10 located on the Corner of Griffith and Iris. This is of major concern to City of Wasco staff due the water capacity issues that already exist. Although Well 10 is eventually going to be replaced by the State Revolving Project it is imperative that we prolong the life of our existing wells. Having this well offline significantly reduces the amount of time wells can be down for maintenance, repairs and reduces our water availability for any future development projects throughout out the city. After internal discussions and reaching out to various experienced well rehabilitation professionals, staff is recommending to drop the well pumping zone by 60 feet. With the well pumping zone being lower we are hoping to mitigate some of the water quality issues that currently exist. A quote has been received from Farm Pump and irrigation in the amount of 14,929.44. With work similar to this, including contingencies in the project budget is appropriate. For this project, a contingency of approximately 20% is appropriate and a total project budget of \$18,000.00 is requested.

Fiscal Impact:

The City will use Water Fund capital outlay funds in the amount not to exceed \$18,000.00 to lower the pumping zone in well 10.

SUBDIVISION AGREEMENT FOR TRACT MAP 7373 – PHASE 2 (49 LOTS)

ΓHIS AGREEMENT, entered into this	day of	, 2022 by and between the CITY OF
WASCO, a Municipal Corporation, herein 1	referred to as the	e "City"; and LEORA, LLC. herein referred to
as the "Developer".		

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Developer is developing and subdividing land in the City of Wasco, under the provisions of the Subdivision Map Act (Government Code Sections 66410 et. seq., referred to as the "Map Act"), and under the provisions of the Subdivision Ordinance of the City of Wasco (Wasco Municipal Code), referred to as the "Ordinance", and

WHEREAS, the tentative map TRACT MAP 7373 has been approved by the Planning Commission of the City (Advisory Agency), subject to certain approved exceptions and conditions; and

WHEREAS, the Developer has submitted the final map to the City Council of the City for approval in accordance with the Map Act and the Ordinance, said final map shall be referred to as the "Final Tract Map 7373 – Phase 2, or "Subdivision"; and

WHEREAS, the Developer has complied with all provisions of the Map Act and the Ordinance applicable to the Subdivision, excepting only that the Developer has not completed the improvement work therefor and has not set or placed all of the permanent monuments required for the Subdivision, but desires to enter into an agreement with the City to complete the required improvement work within the time and in the manner provided herein; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City is willing to approve the Final Tract Map, and to accept on behalf of the City all of the streets, easements and pedestrian ways dedicated thereon or deeded to the City in connection therewith, under the terms and conditions hereinafter more particularly set forth;

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual covenants and conditions herein contained, IT IS EXPRESSLY AGREED AND UNDERSTOOD as follows:

I.

Concurrently upon the execution of this Agreement and upon posting by the Developer of the Improvement Security as mentioned herein, the City, by and through its City Council, does hereby agree to approve the Final Tract Map 7373 – Phase 2, and to accept all streets, easements, and pedestrian ways dedicated thereon or deeded by the Developer to the City in connection therewith. Improvement Security shall be as hereinafter provided for, to be approved by the City Council of the City and shall be in the amounts fixed by said City Council.

II.

For and in consideration of the approval of the Final Tract Map referred to in Paragraph I hereof, and for and in consideration of the acceptance of the streets, easements and pedestrian ways dedicated thereon or deeded to the City in connection therewith, the Developer hereby agrees as follows:

In accordance with the requirements of the City Council, the Developer shall construct, at its sole cost and expense, those improvements, shown on the plans, profiles and specifications, all as approved by the City Engineer, and all of which are incorporated in the Agreement by reference as a part hereof, and which are generally designated as follows: Curbs, gutters, sidewalks, grading, paving, drainage facilities, landscaping, parking, sanitary sewers, water distribution system, street name signs, street lighting and utility systems.

1. IMPROVEMENTS TO BE CONSTRUCTED:

- (a) Developer shall grade, pave, construct and improve all of the Streets, Easements and Pedestrian Ways dedicated to the City or deeded by the Developer to the City in connection therewith, pursuant to and in accordance with those provisions of the Wasco Municipal Code applicable thereto and, more particularly pursuant to and in accordance with the Plans and Profiles, and by this reference incorporated herein.
- (b) Developer shall install a Water Distribution System, including the construction and installation of all pipelines, appurtenances, and services to each lot, pursuant to and in accordance with those provisions of the Wasco Municipal Code applicable thereto, and more particularly pursuant to and in accordance with the Plans, and by reference incorporated herein.
- (c) Developer shall install a Sanitary Sewer System, including the construction and installation of all pipelines, manholes, appurtenances, and services to each lot, pursuant to and in accordance with those provisions of the Wasco Municipal Code applicable thereto, and more particularly pursuant to and in accordance with the Plans and Profiles, and by reference incorporated herein.
- (d) Developer shall site grade, compact and improve building sites, so as to drain properly within the Subdivision, pursuant to and in accordance with the Plans and Specifications, and by reference incorporated herein.
- (e) Developer shall provide for all necessary Storm Drainage Facilities, including the construction and installation of pipelines, sumps, and appurtenances, pursuant to and in accordance with the Wasco Municipal Code applicable thereto, and more particularly pursuant to and in accordance with the Plans and Profiles, and by reference incorporated herein.
- (f) Developer shall construct all public utilities as required by the Wasco Municipal Code. Services from the public utilities, consisting of telephone, gas, electric, water, sewer and cable t.v. service, shall be provided for each lot within this subdivision. This shall also include a Street Lighting System.
 - Developer shall furnish the City with written statements from the Electric Company, Gas Company, Telephone Company, and Cable T.V. Company, specifying that financial arrangements and terms for the installation of all electrical, gas, telephone and cable t.v. services have been made for the subdivision. The terms thereof shall guarantee the installation of said services to each lot as required at no cost to the City and shall be subject to the approval of the City Engineer.
- (g) Developer shall provide for the setting or placement of all permanent monuments required for the Subdivision by the Wasco Municipal Code. Said permanent monuments shall be placed or set in accordance with said Municipal Code and shall be located in such positions and shall be of the character and type specified therein. Property lines shall be marked with a chiseled line on the top of curb.

- (h) Developer shall, remove, relocate or replace all obstructions, or otherwise make all necessary arrangements to have said obstructions relocated, at his own expense. Said obstructions and their removal and/or relocation, shall be shown on all applicable plans and profiles, and shall not hinder any construction.
- (i) All changes, relocations, or modifications required for the development of the proposed subdivision to existing city utilities, streets and facilities whether within the boundaries of the subdivision or offsite, and all changes, relocations and modifications to other public utilities including, but not limited to electric, gas, water or telephone lines, caused by the development of the subdivision shall be paid for by the Developer. If Developer damages any public or private utility, said utility is to be repaired or replaced at Developer's expense.
- (j) Developer shall furnish the City with a written statement from the U.S. Postal Service stating that all required mailboxes for the Subdivision have been installed per the specifications of the Postal Service
- (k) Developer shall, when deemed necessary for emergency vehicle and/or city service vehicle access, construct temporary turnarounds and/or temporary road connections to adjoining public streets to facilitate safe ingress and egress to the development area.
- (l) Items (a) through (k) above shall be completed prior to the issuance of Certificate of Occupancy for any residence within the Subdivision.

2. MANNER OF CONSTRUCTION:

The improvements designated above shall be installed and constructed in accordance with all of the following:

- (a) Wasco Municipal Code.
- (b) Kern County Standards
- (c) The California Subdivision Map Act.
- (d) Approved plans, specifications and profiles.
- (e) Standard City specifications and grades.
- (f) State of California Business and Transportation Agency Standard Specifications (Current Edition).
- (g) Good engineering practices and workmanlike manner.

3. <u>TIME FOR COMPLETION:</u>

All of said improvements shall be completed in full in accordance with the terms of this Agreement and to the satisfaction of the City Engineer within twelve (12) months from the date of approval of this Agreement, to wit: on or before September 20, 2023, or any extension of said completion date granted by the City Council. Any work which affects any existing City maintained road or traffic thereon shall be completed within thirty (30) working days from start of work.

4. <u>INSPECTION AND APPROVAL OF WORK:</u>

- (a) All improvement work shall be subject to inspection by the City's designee and shall be completed to their satisfaction.
- (b) When all of the required improvement work has been satisfactorily completed, upon written application of the Developer, the City's Designee and the Developer and his Engineer or designee shall inspect and approve the same within a reasonable time and shall forward his recommendation to City Council showing the date of inspection and approval.
- (c) If the City Council approves the recommendation, it shall make its order accepting or approving the work of improvement.
- (d) Such order of acceptance or approval made by the City Council shall be deemed operative from the time of approval of the work of improvement by the City's designee, as shown in his said certificate.
- (e) Except as otherwise provided, the Developer and surety shall be deemed released from liability for damage or injury to such work so accepted by said Council, and from the maintenance thereof, from and after the time said order is operative. However, the foregoing provision shall not relieve the Developer or its surety from any damage or injury to such work of improvement or any maintenance required therefor arising from any other work undertaken by the Developer or its surety, or as may necessarily be done by the City in the performance of any part of the required improvement work as a result of any default in the performance of this Agreement by the Developer or its surety or arising from any willful act or negligent act or omission of the Developer or its surety or their contractors, agents or employees, or arising from defective work or labor done or defective materials furnished in the performance of the Agreement.
- (f) At the time of making of the order of acceptance or approval of such work, as the case may be, said Council shall affect a reduction of the improvement security in accordance with other provisions of this Agreement.
- (g) The provisions of (e) notwithstanding, the Developer shall not be released from liability arising from damage or injury to such work of improvements that may have been accepted by the City that has been caused by the construction of new homes and related accessories in the subdivision. A close-out inspection shall be called for by the Developer/Developer prior to the release of the final building permit. All damage or injury shall be corrected prior to the issuance of a certificate of occupancy for the final building.
- (h) Pursuant to City of Wasco Municipal Code Section 16.12.050(C), no final certificate of occupancy shall be granted for any building until such time that all required improvements for Tract 7373 Phase 2 have been completed and accepted by the City Council.

5. **CHANGES AND ALTERATIONS:**

(a) The Developer shall make no change or alteration in such work except with written approval by the City Engineer.

- (b) The Developer shall carry out such changes or alterations in such work as may be ordered by the City Engineer in the exercise of its reasonable discretion, as follows:
 - (i) As required by the Map Act;
 - (ii) As consistent with City ordinance, applicable at the time of approval of the tentative map; or
 - (iii) As made necessary by conditions of the soil, topography, drainage, flood hazard, or fire hazard not foreseen at the time of approval of the tentative map.
- (c) In any case, all changes or alterations in such work shall be otherwise performed and fully and timely completed in accordance with all other provisions of this Agreement.
- (d) Within sixty (60) days following City's acceptance of subdivision improvements, Developer shall provide City Engineer with original set of improvement plans and electronic drawings (AutoCAD) containing the appropriate posted "Record Drawings" changes. Changes shall be clearly noted as changes on said plans.

6. GUARANTEE AGAINST DEFECTS:

The Developer hereby guarantees all features of the work of improvement for a period of 12 months following the acceptance of the work against defective work or labor done, or defective material furnished, in the performance of this Agreement; and Developer agrees to correct, repair or replace promptly when demanded by the City all such defective work or labor done, or defective materials furnished, as may be discovered within such 12 month period and reported to the City Council.

Provided further that the Developer shall repair or replace all features of the work of improvement as directed by the City Engineer that are damaged by construction, including but not limited to dwellings and related accessory features, that occurs after the expiration of the 12 month warrantee. The issuance of the final certificate of occupancy for a dwelling shall be withheld until the damage is corrected.

7. <u>IMPROVEMENT SECURITY:</u>

As provided for in the Wasco Municipal Code, the Agreement shall be secured by good (a) and sufficient security, which shall be filed with the City prior to certification of the final map by the City Engineer. Such improvement security shall consist of either (1) a faithful performance bond or bonds by one or more duly authorized corporate sureties; or (2) a deposit, either with the City or a responsible escrow agent or trust company, selected by the City, of cash or negotiable bonds of the kind approved for securing deposits of public moneys, or (3) an irrevocable instrument of credit form one or more responsible financial institutions regulated by State or Federal government and pledging that the funds are on deposit and guaranteed for payment on demand by the City. The forms of all documents relating to such security shall be subject to approval by the City Attorney. The corporate surety bond shall conform substantially with the form set forth in Section 66499.1 of the Map Act. The estimated cost of the various features of the work of improvement shall be used, if applicable, as the basis for the reduction of bonds in connection with the final completion of any feature of the work (or any unit thereof). Costs referred to herein are as set forth on the Costs Estimate for the Subdivision, as submitted for approval to, and on file in the office of, the City Engineer.

(b) The estimated cost of the various features of the work of improvement, to be used as the basis for determination of the amount of such security and for reduction of security in accordance with other provisions of this Agreement, is as follows:

- (c) Said improvement security shall be in the amount of 100% of the total estimated cost of the improvement, conditioned upon the faithful performance of the Agreement, as follows:
 - (1) The faithful performance and full and timely completion of the work according to this Agreement; and
 - (2) The guarantee and maintenance of the work of improvement for a period of 12 months following the completion and approval thereof, against defective work or labor done, or defective materials furnished, in the performance of this Agreement; and
- (d) Said improvement security shall also be in an additional amount of 50% of the total estimated cost of the improvement, securing payment to the contractor, his subcontractors and to persons renting equipment or furnishing labor or materials to them for the improvement; and if such portion of the improvement security is:
 - (1) A cash deposit, suit may be maintained against the holder of such deposit; or
 - (2) A surety bond, suit may be maintained against the surety, or an instrument of credit, suit may be maintained against the financial institution of obligating itself as trustee on such instrument.

8. <u>REDUCTION AND RELEASE OF SECURITY:</u>

- (a) Improvement security may be reduced or released on order of the City Engineer in accordance with this Section.
- (b) Improvement security given for the faithful performance of the Agreement shall be reduced at the time and in the manner provided herein, subject to retention of security for defects as hereinafter provided.
- (c) Whenever improvement security is reduced on account of approval of units of the work such shall be subject to retention of security for defects and security against damage as hereinafter provided.
- (d) In any case, however, the City in the exercise of its reasonable discretion shall retain ten percent (10%) of the improvement security for faithful performance to secure the maintenance and guarantee of such improvement work for a period of 12 months

following the operative date of the order of said Council for the acceptance or approval thereof, as the case may be, and (in the case of acceptance or approval of a unit of the improvement work as its progresses) to secure the maintenance and guarantee of the work of improvement so accepted or approved against damage thereto by any other work undertaken by the Developer or its surety. The amounts of improvement security so retained shall be finally released one (1) year following the operative date of the order of the city Council for the acceptance or approval thereof, as the case may be, provided that no defective work or labor done or defective materials furnished in the performance of the work has been discovered within such 12 month period and reported in writing to the said Council, and further provided (in the case of acceptance of a unit or units of the improvement work as it progresses) that no damage has been done to the required improvement work so accepted by any other work undertaken by the Developer or its surety.

(e) Improvement security for payment to the contractor, or any of his subcontractors of any person renting equipment or furnishing labor or materials to them for the work of improvement may, six (6) months after the completion of the work of improvement and the making of the order for its acceptance or approval, as the case may be, be reduced to an amount not less than the total of all claims on which an action has been filed and notice thereof given in writing to the City, and if no such action is filed, such improvement security may be released in full.

9 **COMPLETION BY SURETY OR CITY:**

- (a) If the City Council, in the exercise of its reasonable discretion, shall determine:
 - (1) That the Developer has failed to properly and fully complete all of the work of improvement in accordance with this Agreement, and within the time (or any extension of time) provided herein; and
 - (2) That the Developer has failed or neglected to begin work, or any feature of the work, within a time which will reasonably allow its completion within the time (or any extension of time) provided in this Agreement; or
 - (3) That the Developer has created an unsafe or hazardous condition which requires immediate correction.
 - (4) That the Developer has abandoned any of the work; or
 - (5) That the Developer has failed to keep the work under direct control of a superintendent, manager, engineer or other competent agent.
 - (6) That the Developer (if he shall be an individual) has been declared incompetent or placed under the care of a guardian or conservator, or has disappeared; or
 - (7) That the Developer has filed a petition in bankruptcy or has been declared bankrupt then the City Council may determine to, and the City may give the Developer and its Surety fourteen (14) days' written notice to proceed with the work, without prejudice to any other remedy the City may have in law or equity.
- (b) If the Surety shall proceed with the work, the Surety shall be subject to all of the provisions of this Agreement as in the case of the Developer.
- (c) If the Developer or its Surety shall fail or neglect to proceed with the work diligently and in good faith in accordance with this Agreement after such notice has been given, the

City may thereafter, at its sole option and without prejudice to any other remedy, provide the necessary supervision, equipment, materials and labor as it may determine necessary to undertake and complete the work of improvement or any part thereof in the manner required by this Agreement, by independent contract or by City forces, all for the account and at the expense of the Developer, and the Developer and its Surety shall be liable to the City and shall pay the City on demand, any expenses incurred by the City in the course thereof.

10. <u>INDEMNIFICATION PROVISIONS:</u>

- (a) The Developer shall, and it does hereby agree to hold harmless and indemnify the City and its Council, officers and employees, from every liability, claim, suit or demand which may arise or may be made by reason of:
 - (1) Any act, omission or neglect of the Developer, its engineers, employees, agents or contractor; or
 - (2) Any injury to any person, death of any person, or damage to any property, sustained by any person, firm or corporation while in or upon the parcel of land herein mentioned and for which the Developer is legally liable (excepting negligence of the City, or its officers or employees); or
 - (3) Any injury to or death of the Developer or any officer or employee of the Developer, or any damage to the property of any such person, firm or corporation, and for which the Developer is legally liable (excepting any negligence of the City or its officers or employees); or
 - (4) Any damage to or taking of any property arising from said plans, specifications or profiles, or arising from the work of construction or the conduct thereof.
- (b) The Developer at its own cost, expense and risk shall defend all legal proceedings which may be brought against the City, its Council, officers and employees, on any liability suit, claim or demand which it has agreed indemnify them against herein, and shall satisfy any resulting judgment that may be rendered against any of them.
- (c) It is mutually agreed that the Developer's surety under the improvement security for faithful performance shall not be deemed liable for performance of any of the foregoing provisions of this section, unless said surety shall undertake the completion of any improvement or the conduct of work required to be done under this Agreement, and then only to the extent of any act, omission or neglect of the Surety, its engineers, employees, agents or contractors in the course of the completion of such improvements or the conduct of such work by said Surety.

11. <u>ATTORNEY'S FEES ON SUIT:</u>

If any suit be brought by the City for the recovery of any sum due under this Agreement, for any damages for the breach of this Agreement, or to compel performance of this Agreement, the City shall be entitled to such portion of such reasonable attorney's fees as the Court may determine, in addition to its cost of suit.

12. <u>INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS:</u>

(a) The Developer shall at all times during the course of any of the improvement work, secure and maintain, and shall cause its contractors to secure and maintain, in the manner required by law, workers' compensation insurance as required by the California Labor Code and amendments thereto, and shall furnish to the City satisfactory evidence thereof.

- (b) The Developer shall maintain, and pay premiums on, a policy of comprehensive liability insurance in the amounts given below, in form and with insurance companies satisfactory to the City, containing an endorsement including the City, its Council, officers and employees as additional named insured.
- (c) The limits of said policy shall be in amounts not less than Bodily Injury, \$500,000 per person and \$1,000,000 per accident; and Property Damage \$500,000 per accident and \$1,000,000 aggregate amount.
- (d) Prior to undertaking any work of construction, the Developer shall file with the City Clerk, a true copy of said policy of insurance, with the endorsement thereon aforementioned, certified by the carrier.
- (e) The Developer shall continue to so maintain said policy and pay the premiums thereon for a period of one (1) year from and after the acceptance or approval, as the case may be, of the entirety of the improvement work.
- (f) In case the estimated cost of the required work of improvement is found to be less than \$10,000, the City Council may approve limits of insurance coverage in lesser amounts than those specified in (c) above.

13. **FEES:**

The Developer shall pay all fees and charges scheduled pursuant to the Wasco Municipal Code as may be amended from time to time.

14. QUIMBY/ PARK IMPACT FEES

Pursuant to the Wasco Municipal Code, the Developer shall pay Quimby/ Park Impact fee which includes Neighborhood Parks fee and Community Parks fee.

15. **FINAL MAP FEE:**

Pursuant to the Wasco Municipal Code, the Developer shall pay a Public Works Final Map fee which includes all charges for checking and recording the Final Map performed by the City.

16. **PUBLIC WORKS INSPECTION FEE:**

Pursuant to the Wasco Municipal Code, the Developer shall pay a Public Works Inspection fee which includes all charges for inspection by the City of the Subdivision.

17. **COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT:**

Prior to any lot being sold to an individual buyer, the owner(s) shall agree to annex the entire subdivision into a Community Facilities District.

18. **ENGINEERING FEE:**

Pursuant to the Wasco Municipal Code, the Developer shall pay an Engineering Fee which includes all charges for Improvement Plan Check performed by the City. This fee shall be a minimum of (1) percent of the engineer's estimate.

SUBDIVISION AGREEMENT FOR TRACT MAP 7373 – PHASE 3 (30 LOTS)

THIS AGREEMENT, entered into this	day of	, 2022 by and between the CITY OF
WASCO, a Municipal Corporation, herein 1	referred to as the	"City"; and LEORA, LLC. herein referred to
as the "Developer".		

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Developer is developing and subdividing land in the City of Wasco, under the provisions of the Subdivision Map Act (Government Code Sections 66410 et. seq., referred to as the "Map Act"), and under the provisions of the Subdivision Ordinance of the City of Wasco (Wasco Municipal Code), referred to as the "Ordinance", and

WHEREAS, the tentative map TRACT MAP 7373 has been approved by the Planning Commission of the City (Advisory Agency), subject to certain approved exceptions and conditions; and

WHEREAS, the Developer has submitted the final map to the City Council of the City for approval in accordance with the Map Act and the Ordinance, said final map shall be referred to as the "Final Tract Map 7373 – Phase 3, or "Subdivision"; and

WHEREAS, the Developer has complied with all provisions of the Map Act and the Ordinance applicable to the Subdivision, excepting only that the Developer has not completed the improvement work therefor and has not set or placed all of the permanent monuments required for the Subdivision, but desires to enter into an agreement with the City to complete the required improvement work within the time and in the manner provided herein; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City is willing to approve the Final Tract Map, and to accept on behalf of the City all of the streets, easements and pedestrian ways dedicated thereon or deeded to the City in connection therewith, under the terms and conditions hereinafter more particularly set forth;

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual covenants and conditions herein contained, IT IS EXPRESSLY AGREED AND UNDERSTOOD as follows:

I.

Concurrently upon the execution of this Agreement and upon posting by the Developer of the Improvement Security as mentioned herein, the City, by and through its City Council, does hereby agree to approve the Final Tract Map 7373 – Phase 3, and to accept all streets, easements, and pedestrian ways dedicated thereon or deeded by the Developer to the City in connection therewith. Improvement Security shall be as hereinafter provided for, to be approved by the City Council of the City and shall be in the amounts fixed by said City Council.

II.

For and in consideration of the approval of the Final Tract Map referred to in Paragraph I hereof, and for and in consideration of the acceptance of the streets, easements and pedestrian ways dedicated thereon or deeded to the City in connection therewith, the Developer hereby agrees as follows:

In accordance with the requirements of the City Council, the Developer shall construct, at its sole cost and expense, those improvements, shown on the plans, profiles and specifications, all as approved by the City Engineer, and all of which are incorporated in the Agreement by reference as a part hereof, and which are generally designated as follows: Curbs, gutters, sidewalks, grading, paving, drainage facilities, landscaping, parking, sanitary sewers, water distribution system, street name signs, street lighting and utility systems.

1. IMPROVEMENTS TO BE CONSTRUCTED:

- (a) Developer shall grade, pave, construct and improve all of the Streets, Easements and Pedestrian Ways dedicated to the City or deeded by the Developer to the City in connection therewith, pursuant to and in accordance with those provisions of the Wasco Municipal Code applicable thereto and, more particularly pursuant to and in accordance with the Plans and Profiles, and by this reference incorporated herein.
- (b) Developer shall install a Water Distribution System, including the construction and installation of all pipelines, appurtenances, and services to each lot, pursuant to and in accordance with those provisions of the Wasco Municipal Code applicable thereto, and more particularly pursuant to and in accordance with the Plans, and by reference incorporated herein.
- (c) Developer shall install a Sanitary Sewer System, including the construction and installation of all pipelines, manholes, appurtenances, and services to each lot, pursuant to and in accordance with those provisions of the Wasco Municipal Code applicable thereto, and more particularly pursuant to and in accordance with the Plans and Profiles, and by reference incorporated herein.
- (d) Developer shall site grade, compact and improve building sites, so as to drain properly within the Subdivision, pursuant to and in accordance with the Plans and Specifications, and by reference incorporated herein.
- (e) Developer shall provide for all necessary Storm Drainage Facilities, including the construction and installation of pipelines, sumps, and appurtenances, pursuant to and in accordance with the Wasco Municipal Code applicable thereto, and more particularly pursuant to and in accordance with the Plans and Profiles, and by reference incorporated herein.
- (f) Developer shall construct all public utilities as required by the Wasco Municipal Code. Services from the public utilities, consisting of telephone, gas, electric, water, sewer and cable t.v. service, shall be provided for each lot within this subdivision. This shall also include a Street Lighting System.
 - Developer shall furnish the City with written statements from the Electric Company, Gas Company, Telephone Company, and Cable T.V. Company, specifying that financial arrangements and terms for the installation of all electrical, gas, telephone and cable t.v. services have been made for the subdivision. The terms thereof shall guarantee the installation of said services to each lot as required at no cost to the City and shall be subject to the approval of the City Engineer.
- (g) Developer shall provide for the setting or placement of all permanent monuments required for the Subdivision by the Wasco Municipal Code. Said permanent monuments shall be placed or set in accordance with said Municipal Code and shall be located in such positions and shall be of the character and type specified therein. Property lines shall be marked with a chiseled line on the top of curb.

- (h) Developer shall, remove, relocate or replace all obstructions, or otherwise make all necessary arrangements to have said obstructions relocated, at his own expense. Said obstructions and their removal and/or relocation, shall be shown on all applicable plans and profiles, and shall not hinder any construction.
- (i) All changes, relocations, or modifications required for the development of the proposed subdivision to existing city utilities, streets and facilities whether within the boundaries of the subdivision or offsite, and all changes, relocations and modifications to other public utilities including, but not limited to electric, gas, water or telephone lines, caused by the development of the subdivision shall be paid for by the Developer. If Developer damages any public or private utility, said utility is to be repaired or replaced at Developer's expense.
- (j) Developer shall furnish the City with a written statement from the U.S. Postal Service stating that all required mailboxes for the Subdivision have been installed per the specifications of the Postal Service
- (k) Developer shall, when deemed necessary for emergency vehicle and/or city service vehicle access, construct temporary turnarounds and/or temporary road connections to adjoining public streets to facilitate safe ingress and egress to the development area.
- (l) Items (a) through (k) above shall be completed prior to the issuance of Certificate of Occupancy for any residence within the Subdivision.

2. MANNER OF CONSTRUCTION:

The improvements designated above shall be installed and constructed in accordance with all of the following:

- (a) Wasco Municipal Code.
- (b) Kern County Standards
- (c) The California Subdivision Map Act.
- (d) Approved plans, specifications and profiles.
- (e) Standard City specifications and grades.
- (f) State of California Business and Transportation Agency Standard Specifications (Current Edition).
- (g) Good engineering practices and workmanlike manner.

3. <u>TIME FOR COMPLETION:</u>

All of said improvements shall be completed in full in accordance with the terms of this Agreement and to the satisfaction of the City Engineer within twelve (12) months from the date of approval of this Agreement, to wit: on or before September 20, 2023, or any extension of said completion date granted by the City Council. Any work which affects any existing City maintained road or traffic thereon shall be completed within thirty (30) working days from start of work.

4. <u>INSPECTION AND APPROVAL OF WORK:</u>

- (a) All improvement work shall be subject to inspection by the City's designee and shall be completed to their satisfaction.
- (b) When all of the required improvement work has been satisfactorily completed, upon written application of the Developer, the City's Designee and the Developer and his Engineer or designee shall inspect and approve the same within a reasonable time and shall forward his recommendation to City Council showing the date of inspection and approval.
- (c) If the City Council approves the recommendation, it shall make its order accepting or approving the work of improvement.
- (d) Such order of acceptance or approval made by the City Council shall be deemed operative from the time of approval of the work of improvement by the City's designee, as shown in his said certificate.
- (e) Except as otherwise provided, the Developer and surety shall be deemed released from liability for damage or injury to such work so accepted by said Council, and from the maintenance thereof, from and after the time said order is operative. However, the foregoing provision shall not relieve the Developer or its surety from any damage or injury to such work of improvement or any maintenance required therefor arising from any other work undertaken by the Developer or its surety, or as may necessarily be done by the City in the performance of any part of the required improvement work as a result of any default in the performance of this Agreement by the Developer or its surety or arising from any willful act or negligent act or omission of the Developer or its surety or their contractors, agents or employees, or arising from defective work or labor done or defective materials furnished in the performance of the Agreement.
- (f) At the time of making of the order of acceptance or approval of such work, as the case may be, said Council shall affect a reduction of the improvement security in accordance with other provisions of this Agreement.
- (g) The provisions of (e) notwithstanding, the Developer shall not be released from liability arising from damage or injury to such work of improvements that may have been accepted by the City that has been caused by the construction of new homes and related accessories in the subdivision. A close-out inspection shall be called for by the Developer/Developer prior to the release of the final building permit. All damage or injury shall be corrected prior to the issuance of a certificate of occupancy for the final building.
- (h) Pursuant to City of Wasco Municipal Code Section 16.12.050(C), no final certificate of occupancy shall be granted for any building until such time that all required improvements for Tract 7373 Phase 3 have been completed and accepted by the City Council.

5. **CHANGES AND ALTERATIONS:**

(a) The Developer shall make no change or alteration in such work except with written approval by the City Engineer.

- (b) The Developer shall carry out such changes or alterations in such work as may be ordered by the City Engineer in the exercise of its reasonable discretion, as follows:
 - (i) As required by the Map Act;
 - (ii) As consistent with City ordinance, applicable at the time of approval of the tentative map; or
 - (iii) As made necessary by conditions of the soil, topography, drainage, flood hazard, or fire hazard not foreseen at the time of approval of the tentative map.
- (c) In any case, all changes or alterations in such work shall be otherwise performed and fully and timely completed in accordance with all other provisions of this Agreement.
- (d) Within sixty (60) days following City's acceptance of subdivision improvements, Developer shall provide City Engineer with original set of improvement plans and electronic drawings (AutoCAD) containing the appropriate posted "Record Drawings" changes. Changes shall be clearly noted as changes on said plans.

6. GUARANTEE AGAINST DEFECTS:

The Developer hereby guarantees all features of the work of improvement for a period of 12 months following the acceptance of the work against defective work or labor done, or defective material furnished, in the performance of this Agreement; and Developer agrees to correct, repair or replace promptly when demanded by the City all such defective work or labor done, or defective materials furnished, as may be discovered within such 12 month period and reported to the City Council.

Provided further that the Developer shall repair or replace all features of the work of improvement as directed by the City Engineer that are damaged by construction, including but not limited to dwellings and related accessory features, that occurs after the expiration of the 12 month warrantee. The issuance of the final certificate of occupancy for a dwelling shall be withheld until the damage is corrected.

7. <u>IMPROVEMENT SECURITY:</u>

As provided for in the Wasco Municipal Code, the Agreement shall be secured by good (a) and sufficient security, which shall be filed with the City prior to certification of the final map by the City Engineer. Such improvement security shall consist of either (1) a faithful performance bond or bonds by one or more duly authorized corporate sureties; or (2) a deposit, either with the City or a responsible escrow agent or trust company, selected by the City, of cash or negotiable bonds of the kind approved for securing deposits of public moneys, or (3) an irrevocable instrument of credit form one or more responsible financial institutions regulated by State or Federal government and pledging that the funds are on deposit and guaranteed for payment on demand by the City. The forms of all documents relating to such security shall be subject to approval by the City Attorney. The corporate surety bond shall conform substantially with the form set forth in Section 66499.1 of the Map Act. The estimated cost of the various features of the work of improvement shall be used, if applicable, as the basis for the reduction of bonds in connection with the final completion of any feature of the work (or any unit thereof). Costs referred to herein are as set forth on the Costs Estimate for the Subdivision, as submitted for approval to, and on file in the office of, the City Engineer.

(b) The estimated cost of the various features of the work of improvement, to be used as the basis for determination of the amount of such security and for reduction of security in accordance with other provisions of this Agreement, is as follows:

- (c) Said improvement security shall be in the amount of 100% of the total estimated cost of the improvement, conditioned upon the faithful performance of the Agreement, as follows:
 - (1) The faithful performance and full and timely completion of the work according to this Agreement; and
 - (2) The guarantee and maintenance of the work of improvement for a period of 12 months following the completion and approval thereof, against defective work or labor done, or defective materials furnished, in the performance of this Agreement; and
- (d) Said improvement security shall also be in an additional amount of 50% of the total estimated cost of the improvement, securing payment to the contractor, his subcontractors and to persons renting equipment or furnishing labor or materials to them for the improvement; and if such portion of the improvement security is:
 - (1) A cash deposit, suit may be maintained against the holder of such deposit; or
 - (2) A surety bond, suit may be maintained against the surety, or an instrument of credit, suit may be maintained against the financial institution of obligating itself as trustee on such instrument.

8. <u>REDUCTION AND RELEASE OF SECURITY:</u>

- (a) Improvement security may be reduced or released on order of the City Engineer in accordance with this Section.
- (b) Improvement security given for the faithful performance of the Agreement shall be reduced at the time and in the manner provided herein, subject to retention of security for defects as hereinafter provided.
- (c) Whenever improvement security is reduced on account of approval of units of the work such shall be subject to retention of security for defects and security against damage as hereinafter provided.
- (d) In any case, however, the City in the exercise of its reasonable discretion shall retain ten percent (10%) of the improvement security for faithful performance to secure the maintenance and guarantee of such improvement work for a period of 12 months

following the operative date of the order of said Council for the acceptance or approval thereof, as the case may be, and (in the case of acceptance or approval of a unit of the improvement work as its progresses) to secure the maintenance and guarantee of the work of improvement so accepted or approved against damage thereto by any other work undertaken by the Developer or its surety. The amounts of improvement security so retained shall be finally released one (1) year following the operative date of the order of the city Council for the acceptance or approval thereof, as the case may be, provided that no defective work or labor done or defective materials furnished in the performance of the work has been discovered within such 12 month period and reported in writing to the said Council, and further provided (in the case of acceptance of a unit or units of the improvement work as it progresses) that no damage has been done to the required improvement work so accepted by any other work undertaken by the Developer or its surety.

(e) Improvement security for payment to the contractor, or any of his subcontractors of any person renting equipment or furnishing labor or materials to them for the work of improvement may, six (6) months after the completion of the work of improvement and the making of the order for its acceptance or approval, as the case may be, be reduced to an amount not less than the total of all claims on which an action has been filed and notice thereof given in writing to the City, and if no such action is filed, such improvement security may be released in full.

9 **COMPLETION BY SURETY OR CITY:**

- (a) If the City Council, in the exercise of its reasonable discretion, shall determine:
 - (1) That the Developer has failed to properly and fully complete all of the work of improvement in accordance with this Agreement, and within the time (or any extension of time) provided herein; and
 - (2) That the Developer has failed or neglected to begin work, or any feature of the work, within a time which will reasonably allow its completion within the time (or any extension of time) provided in this Agreement; or
 - (3) That the Developer has created an unsafe or hazardous condition which requires immediate correction.
 - (4) That the Developer has abandoned any of the work; or
 - (5) That the Developer has failed to keep the work under direct control of a superintendent, manager, engineer or other competent agent.
 - (6) That the Developer (if he shall be an individual) has been declared incompetent or placed under the care of a guardian or conservator, or has disappeared; or
 - (7) That the Developer has filed a petition in bankruptcy or has been declared bankrupt then the City Council may determine to, and the City may give the Developer and its Surety fourteen (14) days' written notice to proceed with the work, without prejudice to any other remedy the City may have in law or equity.
- (b) If the Surety shall proceed with the work, the Surety shall be subject to all of the provisions of this Agreement as in the case of the Developer.
- (c) If the Developer or its Surety shall fail or neglect to proceed with the work diligently and in good faith in accordance with this Agreement after such notice has been given, the

- (e) The Developer shall continue to so maintain said policy and pay the premiums thereon for a period of one (1) year from and after the acceptance or approval, as the case may be, of the entirety of the improvement work.
- (f) In case the estimated cost of the required work of improvement is found to be less than \$10,000, the City Council may approve limits of insurance coverage in lesser amounts than those specified in (c) above.

13. **FEES:**

The Developer shall pay all fees and charges scheduled pursuant to the Wasco Municipal Code as may be amended from time to time.

14. **QUIMBY/ PARK IMPACT FEES**

Pursuant to the Wasco Municipal Code, the Developer shall pay Quimby/ Park Impact fee which includes Neighborhood Parks fee and Community Parks fee.

15. **FINAL MAP FEE:**

Pursuant to the Wasco Municipal Code, the Developer shall pay a Public Works Final Map fee which includes all charges for checking and recording the Final Map performed by the City.

16. **PUBLIC WORKS INSPECTION FEE:**

Pursuant to the Wasco Municipal Code, the Developer shall pay a Public Works Inspection fee which includes all charges for inspection by the City of the Subdivision.

17. **COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT:**

Prior to any lot being sold to an individual buyer, the owner(s) shall agree to annex the entire subdivision into a Community Facilities District.

18. **ENGINEERING FEE:**

Pursuant to the Wasco Municipal Code, the Developer shall pay an Engineering Fee which includes all charges for Improvement Plan Check performed by the City. This fee shall be a minimum of (1) percent of the engineer's estimate.
